A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CIVIL SERVICE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 76-103, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 "**§76-103 Veteran's preference.** The extent to which
4 veteran's preference shall be given to [~~veterans, to disabled~~]:

5 (1) Veterans who served:

6 (A) During a war;

7 (B) During the period beginning April 28, 1952
8 through July 1, 1955;

9 (C) For more than one hundred eighty consecutive
10 days, other than for training, any part of which
11 occurred after January 31, 1955, and before
12 October 15, 1976;

13 (D) During the Gulf War from August 2, 1990 through
14 January 2, 1992;

15 (E) For more than one hundred eighty consecutive
16 days, other than for training, any part of which
17 occurred during the period beginning



1 September 11, 2001, and ending on the date
 2 prescribed by Presidential proclamation or by law
 3 as the last day of Operation Iraqi Freedom; or
 4 (F) In a campaign or expedition for which a campaign
 5 medal has been authorized; provided that any
 6 armed forces expeditionary medal or campaign
 7 badge, including El Salvador, Lebanon, Grenada,
 8 Panama, southwest Asia, Somalia, and Haiti,
 9 qualifies for preference;

- 10 (2) Disabled veterans [~~, to spouses~~];
 11 (3) Spouses of disabled veterans [~~, and to surviving~~]; and
 12 (4) Surviving spouses of deceased servicemen who have not
 13 remarried,

14 shall be provided by rules and regulations."

15 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
 16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

17 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
