RELATING TO EXCHANGE ACCOMMODATION. CPC/JUD, FIN HB 2112 Regulates the profession of exchange accommodation. Status CPC/JUD RELATING TO MORTGAGE FORECLOSURES. HB 2132 Requires foreclosing lenders to notify their mortgagors about mortgage **Status** counseling. Makes foreclosure void if notice not provided. CPC/JUD RELATING TO USED MOTOR VEHICLE SALES. HB 1856 Requires dealers to disclose material facts, as well as material Status mechanical defects, to consumers of used motor vehicles. Requires dealers to use good faith and due care in preparing disclosure notice to consumers of used motor vehicles. CPC/TRN, FIN RELATING TO MOTOR CARRIERS. HB 1887 Excludes ground transportation of passengers and freight from Status regulation by the public utilities commission. Repeals the motor carrier

HB 1889 Status RELATING TO THE CONSTRUCTION AUTHORITY.

CPC/EBM, FIN

Establishes a construction authority to be attached to the department of accounting and general services to oversee statewide procurement for construction, the facilitation of permit processing, and professional and vocational licensing of contractors, electricians, plumbers, elevator mechanics, professional engineers, architects, surveyors, and landscape architects. Creates a special fund funded by professional licensing fees and the general excise tax upon contractors.
