HB 2764 Status	RELATING TO MIXED MARTIAL ARTS CONTESTS. Removes requirement that a mixed martial arts contest promoter pay 2% of gross sales price relating to broadcasting, television, Internet, and motion picture rights in order to receive a permit.	CPC, FIN
HB 2642 Status	RELATING TO UTILITIES REGULATION. Appropriates moneys for the reorganization of the PUC and the division of consumer advocacy.	CPC, FIN
