RELATING TO CONTINUING EDUCATION FOR NURSES.

Requires nurses licensed in the state to complete 15 hours of continuing education during each two-year license period as a

requirement for license renewal. (HB2205 HD1)

HB 2921, HD1 (HSCR125-10) Status

RELATING TO LICENSING.

HED, CPC

Revises the minimum requirements for licensure of electricians.

Effective July 1, 2013. (HB2921 HD1)

HB 2906 <u>Status</u>

RELATING TO PSYCHOLOGICAL TESTING.

**CPC** 

Authorizes social workers, marriage and family therapists, advanced practice registered nurses, and physician assistants to engage in psychological testing, provided that they hold at least master's degrees.

Defines "psychological testing".
