HB 1926 **Status**

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM.

EBM/CPC, FIN

Establishes the department of business, economic development, and tourism operation special fund. Imposes a surcharge on the fees charged by certain departments for certain business- and commercerelated authorizations and services. Requires the deposit of the surcharge revenues, as well as \$2 million from the financial institutions tax, into the special fund. Requires moneys in the special fund to be used for the operation of the department of business, economic development, and tourism. Takes effect on 7/1/10 and sunsets on 6/30/15.

HB 2065 Status

EBM/CPC, FIN RELATING TO THE SMALL BUSINESS REGULATORY REVIEW BOARD.

Transfers the administrative assignment of the small business regulatory review board from the department of business, economic development, and tourism to the department of commerce and consumer affairs.
