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<u>SB 2110</u> <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING. Expedites the construction of affordable housing units by requiring ministerial permits associated with the project to be issued by the state or county within forty-five days of acceptance of the permit application for the project.	EDH/TIA, WTL
<u>SB 2111</u> <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING. Shortens the time period within which counties may accept or reject requests for dedication of infrastructure for affordable housing. Clarifies provisions to facilitate the expeditious development of affordable housing.	EDH/TIA, WTL
<u>SB 2116</u> <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO INDEMNIFICATION OF COUNTY AGENCIES. Facilitates the process by which the department of education obtains approval for the State to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless a county agency, its officers, agents, and employees for public school purposes and functions on county facilities.	EDH/TIA, JGO
<u>SB 2276</u> <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO INTOXICATING LIQUOR. Prohibits possession of open liquor containers in public housing common areas and on public streets and sidewalks.	EDH/TIA, JGO
<u>SB 2433</u> <u>Testimony</u> Status	RELATING TO THE COUNTIES. Expands the use of community facilities district special taxes to include educational services, including teacher salaries.	EDH/TIA, WAM

<u>SB 2575</u>	RELATING TO HOUSING.
Testimony	Creates an anti-speculation capital gains tax on real property. Requires public housing provided by county or state financing to remain
<u>Status</u>	affordable in perpetuity. Provides that the restriction on the resale of affordable housing to "qualified residents" shall apply in perpetuity.
