Gives the Board of Education the power to restructure the Department of Education to ensure that it is decentralized in a manner to promote student growth and achievement and greater accountability, and monitor and protect

student rights provided by law.

HB 2424 Status PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO THE HAWAII

CONSTITUTION RELATING TO THE BOARD OF EDUCATION.

Amends provision of state constitution to redistrict the board of education, to provide for one board member for every three representative districts. Requires that members reside in the board district that the member represents, and requires that the members be

elected by the qualified voters in the respective district.
