Establishes the energy industry monitoring and analysis program within DBEDT. Suspends the petroleum industry monitoring and

reporting program in the PUC.

HB 2971 Status

RELATING TO RENEWABLE ENERGY FACILITY SITING

PROCESS.

Requires the energy resources coordinate to include representatives from the island where a renewable energy facility is proposed to be included in determining terms and conditions of permit plan. Adds community benefits agreements as subject to determination by

government agencies, applicant, and residents.

HB 2643 Status

RELATING TO CLEAN ENERGY BONDS.

Establishes a property assessed clean energy bond financing program for renewable energy system and energy efficiency improvements on residential and commercial properties, and authorizes the issuance of

general obligation bonds to finance the program.

RELATING TO SOLID WASTE.

Applies the solid waste disposal surcharge to waste that is deposited in a landfill, incinerator, or waste-to-energy facility, and applies the

surcharge to waste that is shipped out of state for disposal.

HB 2427

RELATING TO SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT.

Changes the interval between revisions of county solid waste

management plans from 5 to 10 years and as necessary.

HB 2125

RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION.

Status

Requires businesses in the State to collect an offset fee for each plastic

disposable checkout bag distributed to customers.
