RELATING TO RENEWABLE ENERGY.

the general excise tax on wholesale and retail transactions from

January 1, 2011, to December 31, 2015.

HB 2643

RELATING TO CLEAN ENERGY BONDS.

Establishes a property assessed clean energy bond financing program

for renewable energy system and energy efficiency improvements on residential and commercial properties, and authorizes the issuance of

general obligation bonds to finance the program.

HB 2237

RELATING TO RENEWABLE FUELS.

Status

Amends the ethanol facility income tax credit to include other liquid biofuels, and to enable larger facilities to be eligible for the tax

incentive.

HB 2922

RELATING TO SOLID WASTE.

Status

Prohibits the incineration or disposal of fluorescent and compact

fluorescent light bulbs in landfills and waste-to-energy facilities in the

State.



HB 2971 Status

RELATING TO RENEWABLE ENERGY FACILITY SITING

PROCESS.

Requires the energy resources coordinate to include representatives from the island where a renewable energy facility is proposed to be included in determining terms and conditions of permit plan. Adds

community benefits agreements as subject to determination by

government agencies, applicant, and residents.

RELATING TO TAXATION.

Requires a marine terminal operator, rather than a distributor, to collect

the environmental response tax from the owner of petroleum products
