HB 2706 (HSCR167-10) RELATING TO THE PERMITTED TRANSFERS IN TRUST ACT.

CPC, FIN

Status

Creates the Permitted Transfers in Trust Act to govern transfers of currency, bonds, and securities from a transferor to a trustee by means of an irrevocable trust instrument. Specifies that the rule against perpetuities does not apply to transfers pursuant to the Permitted

Transfers in Trust Act.

HB 2642 (HSCR162-10) RELATING TO UTILITIES REGULATION.

Appropriates moneys for the reorganization of the PUC and the division of consumer advocacy.

HB 2302, HD1

RELATING TO INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY.

CPC, FIN

(HSCR262-10) Status

Transfers responsibilities for developing and implementing statewide technology policies from the Department of Accounting and General Services to the Office of the Lieutenant Governor. Creates the position of Chief Information Officer. Creates and funds the shared services

technology special fund.

HB 2029, HD1 (HSCR292-10) RELATING TO PROFESSIONS AND OCCUPATIONS.

CPC, FIN

Repeals the regulatory programs for barbers and cosmetologists, marriage and family therapists, athlete agents, hearing aid dealers and Status

fitters, and electrologists.



HB 1927, HD1 (HSCR261-10) Status

RELATING TO OWNER-BUILDERS.

Amends the Owner-Builder Law by: (1) Allowing an exemption for the sale or lease of a property by an owner builder prior to the expiration of the one-year prohibition period in the event of hardship; (2) Defining when a construction or improvement is completed; (3) Exempting improvements pursuant to an approved building permit where the estimated valuation as reflected in the building permit is less than \$10,000; (4) Establishing fines for the failure of an owner-builder to comply with the requirements set forth in the disclosure statement provided to the owner-builder by the county. Effective January 1,
