RELATING TO COUNTY BOARDS OF WATER SUPPLY.

Allow officials other than a County Auditor to issue warrants to disburse funds for a Board of Water Supply. Allows a Board of Water

Supply to prescribe powers and duties for a Manager and Chief

Engineer to disburse funds.

HB 2689, HD1 (HSCR254-10)

RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL WATER SYSTEMS.

Exempts conveyances of agricultural water systems to Board of Agriculture from subdivision requirements; requires notice of conveyance to applicable county. Effective July 1, 2020.
