HB 2983, HD1 (HSCR387-10) Status

RELATING TO PSYCHOTROPIC MEDICATION.

HUS/HLT, FIN

Prohibits the Department of Human Services from imposing any restriction or limitation on the coverage for, or a recipient's access, to psychotropic medication prescribed by a naturopathic physician licensed in the state. Requires annual reports to include the cost and impact of naturopathic physicians prescribing medications that are not

part of the existing formulary. Effective January 1, 2050.

Mandates a financial management improvement program and additional reporting requirements for state agencies consistent with department of finance guidance.
