HB 2488, HD1 (HSCR343-10)

<u>Status</u>

RELATING TO THE HOMELESS.

HSG/WLO, FIN

Increases by 15% the conveyance tax on the sale of homes valued at \$1,200,000 and more to finance the purchase and maintenance of parks under the jurisdiction of the counties to serve the homeless. Requires

the counties to provide matching funds.

HB 2318, HD1 (HSCR381-10) RELATING TO THE HOMELESS.

Status

Establishes a 5-year housing first pilot program developed by the Hawaii Public Housing Authority, in collaboration with the Department of Human Services, to assist chronically homeless individuals. Increases the conveyance tax by fifteen percent on homes

valued at \$1,200,000 and over to fund the parks for homeless special

fund.

HB 2280, HD1 (HSCR400-10)

Status

RELATING TO THE HOMELESS.

HSG, FIN

Assists the homeless in reuniting with their families. Creates the parks for homeless special fund. Increases the conveyance tax by fifteen percent on homes valued at \$1,200,000 and more to be deposited into

the parks for homeless special fund
