Establishes fees for permits, letters, and the registration of plants, animals, and microorganisms allowed entry into the state. (HB2775

HD1)

HB 823, HD2 (HSCR330-10) RELATING TO HEALTH INSURANCE.

HLT, CPC, FIN

Status

Mandates health insurance coverage for colorectal cancer screening based on the recommendations of the U.S. Preventative Service Task Force. Requires health insurance providers in Hawaii to provide their insured with information about the risks of undiagnosed colorectal cancer and encourage their insured to consult with their physician

about screening options. (HB823 HD2)

HB 2670, HD1 (HSCR150-10) Status

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

HED, FIN

Increases to \$5,000,000 the cap on the amount of expenditures that the UH Board of Regents can authorize from the UH Tuition and Fees Special Fund for the promotion of alumni relations and generation of

private donations. Effective July 1, 2050. (HB2670 HD1)

HB 2937, HD1 (HSCR359-10) Status

RELATING TO COLLECTIVE BARGAINING.

LAB, FIN

Clarifies that EUTF contributions are a topic of negotiation in collective bargaining. Stipulates that the arbitration panel shall render

a final and binding decision on contributions to the EUTF.

Establishes comprehensive child abduction prevention law. Lists

factors to determine risk of abduction, and establishes measures courts may include in order to prevent abduction both before and after

issuance of child custody decrees. Effective 01/01/2050.
