Status

LANDS.

Provides that 5% of funds derived from the public land trust shall be expended by the department of Hawaiian home lands for development

of farm and home ownership.

HB 2116

RELATING TO NATIVE HAWAIIANS.

HAW, FIN

Status

Reduces from 50% to 25% the amount of blood quantum needed to

qualify for Hawaiian Homes leases and certain services of the office of

Hawaiian affairs.
