SB 2163, SD2 (SSCR2413) Status

RELATING TO THE PRACTICE OF NURSING.

HLT, CPC

Defines the practice of nursing; directs the state board of nursing to adopt certain provisions of the NCSBN Model Nursing Practice Act and Model Nursing Administrative Rules; delineates the scope of practice for registered nurses, licensed practical nurses, and advanced practice registered nurses; repeals Hawaii Administrative Rules relating to prescriptive authority for advanced practice registered nurses and amends the definition of "advanced practice nurse with prescriptive authority" to reflect this. (SD2)

SB 2267, SD2 (SSCR2455)

Status

RELATING TO BUILDING DESIGN FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES.

HLT, FIN

Allows the disability and communication access board to charge a fee to defray expenses of review of construction plans to ensure compliance with law. Establishes temporary fees until the board adopts permanent fees. Effective date 1/1/2050. (SD1)

SB 2390, SD2 (SSCR2414) Status

RELATING TO PHARMACIST LICENSURE.

HLT, CPC

Broadens the practical experience requirements for a pharmacist license to include experience obtained in U.S. territories and the District of Columbia. Removes the requirement that supervision must take place in a pharmacy. Broadens the experience requirements to

relate to the practice of pharmacy. (SD2)

SB 2490, SD2 (SSCR2478)

Status

RELATING TO COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTERS.

HLT, FIN

Appropriates moneys from the community health centers special fund to be used by community health centers in the State. Directs the administration and the department of health to release funds to the community health centers. Effective 07/01/2050. (SD2)

SB 2611, SD2 (SSCR2439) Status	RELATING TO VITAL STATISTICS. Requires the clerk and real property assessment division of each county, at agreed upon intervals, to provide a list of names of all registered voters and individuals receiving real property tax exemptions to the department of health. Upon receipt, requires department to verify the date of death for any person on the list. Authorizes the department of health to charge fees for verifications. Effective 7/1/2099.	HLT, FIN
SB 2770, SD1 (SSCR2516) Status	RELATING TO REMOTE DISPENSING PHARMACY. Clarifies the definitions of "remote dispensing machine" and "remote dispensing pharmacy". (SD1)	HLT, CPC
SB 2729, SD2 (SSCR2440) Status	RELATING TO IMMUNIZATION.  Authorizes the Department of Health to establish and maintain a single repository of immunization records to be designated as the "Hawaii Immunization Registry" in order to aid, coordinate, and help promote efficient and cost-effective screening, prevention, and control of vaccine preventable diseases, including pandemic influenza.	HLT, FIN
SB 2266 (SSCR2004) Status	RELATING TO DRIVER LICENSING. Requires the examiner of drivers to design and implement a system for allowing license applicants to voluntarily indicate their blood type on a driver's license.	HLT, TRN
SB 2474, SD1 (SSCR2550) Status	RELATING TO INTOXICATING LIQUOR VIOLATIONS INVOLVING MINORS. Establishes an immunity from prosecution for consumption of intoxicating liquor by a minor if the minor summons medical treatment for another minor who requires such treatment as a result of consuming liquor. Also applies to the intoxicated minor and one or two other	HLT, JUD/CPC
