RELATING TO MEDICAID ELIGIBILITY.

Requires the Department of Human Services (DHS) to provide presumptive eligibility coverage to patients who have been waitlisted for Medicaid. Requires DHS to submit a report to the Legislature of its findings and recommendations regarding costs and other issues related to Medicaid presumptive eligibility. Requires DHS to conduct a study of a computerized system for processing Medicaid applications and submit a report to the Legislature of its findings and recommendations for an alternative system for processing Medicaid applications. Appropriates funds for reimbursements to providers or plans for services provided for individuals who are granted presumptive eligibility but are later determined to be ineligible. Effective July 1,
