SB 2343 RELATING TO INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR MAMMOGRAMS. HTH, CPN

<u>Testimony</u>

Prohibits an insurer from requiring a doctor's referral for annual mammograms for covered individuals over forty years old.

SB 2267 RELATING TO BUILDING DESIGN FOR PERSONS WITH HTH, WAM

Testimony DISABILITIES.

Allows the disability and communication access board to charge a fee

Status to defray expenses of review of construction plans to ensure

compliance with law. Establishes temporary fees until the board

adopts permanent fees.

SB 2140 RELATING TO TRANS FATS. HTH, CPN

Testimony

Prohibits foods containing artificial trans fat from being stored, distributed, or served by, or used in the preparation of any food within, a food establishment. Commences with ban on oils, shortening, and

margarines with trans fat effective 01/01/11, and progresses with ban

on food containing trans fat effective 01/01/12.

SB 2036 RELATING TO TOXIC SUBSTANCES. HTH

Testimony Establishes the toxic mold remediation task force to examine the potential hazards of toxic indoor mold and fungal contamination, and

Status to recommend standards and guidelines for its prevention and

remediation.

<u>SB 2071</u>	RELATING TO SMOKING.	HTH, JGO
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Testimony Prohibits smoking at public bus stops, parks, beaches.

**Status** 

SB 2010 RELATING TO NEWBORN SCREENING. HTH, WAM

Requires the department of health to screen for certain newborn

diseases, disorders, and deficiencies.

SB 2211 RELATING TO HEALTHCARE. HTH, WAM

Testimony

Transitions the Hawaii health systems corporation to federal and state nonprofit status. Makes appropriation for general obligation bonds for

SB 2274 RELATING TO THE ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL PURPOSE HTH, WAM

Testimony

REVENUE BONDS TO ASSIST HAWAII PACIFIC HEALTH.

Authorizes the issuance of SPRBs to assist Hawaii Pacific Health in financing, refinancing, and/or reimbursing costs related to the

acquisition or construction of health care facilities.
