Authorizes certified shorthand reporters to administer oaths or affirmations and to perform the duties of a deposition officer.

Requires maintenance of public beach accesses by adjacent landowners and imposes penalties for noncompliance. Establishes shoreline access

RELATING TO DANGEROUS INSTRUMENTS.

Expands scope of offenses of terroristic threatening in the first degree and robbery in the first degree to include the use of a replica firearm.

RELATING TO OFFENSES AGAINST PUBLIC ORDER.

Permits tethering of an unattended dog if the tether meets certain specifications and the dog is at least 6 months old. Establishes

mandatory fines.

HB 2725 Amends the definition of necessary sustenance to include a primary pet Status enclosure that provides shelter; safe construction to prevent injury; room to stand, sit, or lie down; and safe interactions with other animals.
