RELATING TO OUT-OF-STATE OFFICES.

EBM, LMG, FIN

Beginning July 1, 2010, requires the auditor to conduct at least every two years a management and financial audit of the department of business, economic development, and tourism out-of-state offices; requires reports to the legislature; repeals exemption from audit and

accounting requirements for out-of-state offices.

HB 2327 Status

RELATING TO ETHICS.

LMG, JUD

Codifies the standards for evaluation of whether a gift is a violation of the ethics code; the reasonable reliance on past published opinions by the ethics commission and legislators and employees; and a reconsideration process in which a violator may seek reconsideration

from an ethics commission decision.

HB 2902, HD1 (HSCR189-10) Status

RELATING TO PUBLIC EDUCATION GOVERNMENT TELEVISION.

LMG

Statutorily distributes cable franchise fees received by the State to support public, educational, or governmental access facilities, services,

or programming. (HB2902 HD1)

Statutorily establishes the joint legislative keiki caucus and joint legislative kupuna caucus. Effective January 1, 2050. (HB2144 HD1)

HB 2101 (HSCR78-10) Status RELATING TO CUSTOMER SERVICE.

LAB, LMG, FIN

Directs the ombudsman to develop and implement a pilot program using informed customers to investigate customer service at state

agencies.

<u>HB 2276</u> (HSCR68-10) Status RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY.

PBS, LMG, FIN

Requires bills to amend or create new offenses, or to change parole or probation procedures, to be accompanied by a correctional impact statement. Requires assistance of the corrections population

management commission to prepare corrections population impact.
