DECISION MAKING ON THE FOLLOWING MEASURE(S):

SB 2202 RELATING TO THE CIVIL DEFENSE AND EMERGENCY ACT. PSM. JGO

Testimony Extends immunity from liability to a person who voluntarily permits the use of the person's property to shelter people during a natural or

man-made disaster.

SB 2243 RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY. PSM, JGO

Testimony Requires bills to amend or create new offenses, or to change parole or probation procedures, to be accompanied by a correctional impact

statement. Requires assistance of the corrections population management commission to prepare corrections population impact.

SB 2365 RELATING TO CONSUMER FIREWORKS. PSM, JGO

<u>Testimony</u> Imposes a total ban on consumer fireworks except for permitted

Status religious or cultural purposes.

SB 2212 RELATING TO THE MEDICAL USE OF MARIJUANA. PSM/HTH, JGO
Testimony Allows probationers and parolees who meet the requirements of [Measure added 02-

TestimonyAllows probationers and parolees who meet the requirements of
qualifying patients to request that the terms of their probation or parole[Measure
04-10]

be modified to be allowed the medical use of marijuana.

SB 2141 RELATING TO MEDICAL CANNABIS.

Testimony Increases the amount of cannabis that constitutes an adequate amount by allowing a qualifying patient to possess 10 cannabis plants and 5

by allowing a qualifying patient to possess 10 cannabis plants and 5 ounces of cannabis at any given time. Makes identification of the site where cannabis is grown confidential. Prohibits the department of public safety from requiring that a certifying physician be the patient's primary care physician. Prohibits certifying physicians from naming or describing a patient's particular debilitating condition. Increases the permissible ratio of patients to caregivers by allowing a caregiver to

grow cannabis for no more than 4 patients.

SB 2919 **Testimony** Status

RELATING TO THE HAWAII STATE HOSPITAL. Requires the department of public safety to provide security at the State's secure psychiatric rehabilitation facility at Kaneohe. Requires

report from DOH, with collaboration from PSD, to the legislature on its plan for the provision of short and long-term security for the

Kaneohe facility and increasing and aging forensic population needs.

SB 2213 **Testimony** Status

RELATING TO COUNTIES. Provides that each county has the power to establish medical marijuana dispensaries. Requires that medical marijuana dispensaries shall only

provide service to qualified patients and primary caregivers registered with the department of public safety. Makes dispensaries subject to the general excise tax by making inapplicable the exemption for amounts received from sales of prescription drugs or prosthetic devices.
