Authorizes the use of moneys from the works of art special fund for specific state foundation on culture and the arts personnel costs; deletes exclusion from the one per cent amount; requires an annual report to the governor and the legislature; use of the fund for personnel costs sunsets June 30, 2013; effective July 1, 2050.

Requires athletic trainers to register with the department of commerce

RELATING TO ACTIVITY DESKS.

TCI, CPC/JUD

(SSCR2422) **Status** 

Establishes record keeping and trust account requirements for client trust accounts held by activity desks. Clarifies that activity desks shall

include registration numbers on all advertising materials. Requires an activity desk to obtain full payment for activities prior to or at the time reservations are made, subject to certain exceptions. Increases required amount of bond or letter of credit to \$250,000. (SD2)
