SB 2003 Testimony Status	RELATING TO STATE IDENTIFICATION. Allows the attorney general to contract with counties for processing and issuing state identification cards. Clarifies that counties may utilize driver licensing offices or other suitable county facilities to issue state identification cards.	TIA, JGO
SB 2142 Testimony Status	RELATING TO CIVIL IDENTIFICATION. Allows an applicant for a state civil identification card to present a Matricula Consular Identification from Argentina to satisfy the information requirements for registration.	TIA, JGO
SB 2059 Testimony Status	RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH BENEFITS TRUST FUND BOARD OF TRUSTEES. Adds an eleventh trustee to the board of trustees of the EUTF to represent county public employers.	TIA, LBR
SB 2174 Testimony Status	RELATING TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM. Replaces a public member on the Board of Trustees of the Employees' Retirement System with a member selected by the Council of Mayors.	TIA, LBR
SB 2175 Testimony Status	RELATING TO THE EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH BENEFITS TRUST FUND. Requires one trustee of the employer-union health benefits trust fund to be occupied by a representative appointed by the Hawaii council of mayors to represent county interests.	TIA, LBR
SB 2177 Testimony Status	RELATING TO COUNTIES. Requires that county police chiefs be appointed and removed as prescribed by each county's charter.	TIA
SB 2178 Testimony Status	RELATING TO COUNTIES. Amends law to allow the personnel directors of Kauai, Maui, and Hawaii counties to be appointed and removed by either the merit appeals board or mayor of the county.	TIA

SB 2179 RELATING TO COUNTIES. TIA

Testimony Extends the power to appoint county liquor administrators to the

county liquor control adjudication boards.

SB 2160 RELATING TO BICYCLES AND MOPED FEES. TIA, JGO

Testimony Adds a fine as a penalty for having an unregistered bicycle or moped.
