#### RELATING TO TAXATION.

WAM

Temporarily suspends the income tax net operating loss carryback deduction for losses generated in 2009 and 2010. Places a cap on itemized deductions claimed on state income tax returns. Applies to taxable years beginning after 12/31/09 and sunsets on 12/31/15. Removes the refunding feature of the capital goods excise tax credit from 01/01/10 to 12/31/15. Effective July 1, 2020. (HB1907 HD1)

# RELATING TO IMPROPER PAYMENTS ELIMINATION AND RECOVERY.

WAM

Establishes procedures to eliminate and recover improper payments made by a State agency, State contractor, State grantee, or a governmental or other organization administering a State program or activity, to any non-State person or entity. Requires the head of each agency to conduct a financial management improvement program and additional reporting requirements for State agencies consistent with rules prescribed by the Director of Finance. Effective July 1, 2020. (HB2186 HD1)

# RELATING TO CONFORMITY OF THE HAWAII INCOME TAX LAW TO THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE.

Conforming amendments to the Hawaii income tax law based upon amendments to the Internal Revenue Code for calendar year 2009. (HB2594 HD2)

#### RELATING TO TAX CREDITS.

Provides for the statutory ordering of income tax credits, which requires the claiming of refundable credits first, followed by nonrefundable credits.

Amends the due dates for miscellaneous tax types from the last day of the month to the twentieth day of the month to conform with the general excise tax payment deadline. Amends the due date for filing and payment of quarterly periodic insurance premiums taxes from
