HB 2087, HD1, SD1 (SSCR2757) Testimony Status	RELATING TO HEALTH. Requires health insurers to promptly pay claims for services to medicaid recipients, by repealing the exemption for medicaid claims from the clean claims law. Requires the State to pay interest on delayed payments. Authorizes expenditures from the hurricane reserve trust fund and matching American Recovery and Reinvestment Act funds. Takes effect July 1, 2050. (SD1)	HMS/CPN, WAM
HB 2774, HD2, SD1 (SSCR2824) Testimony Status	RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES. Requires the department of human services to include certain provisions in each contract with managed care organizations for the provision of Medicaid benefits under QUEST; makes amendments to the QUEST psychotropic benefits; provides a state lump-sum death benefit in an amount equal to the Social Security Administration's lump-sum death benefit for deceased medical or financial assistance recipients who are ineligible for the Social Security Administration benefit. Prohibits the DHS from any expenditures appropriated for Medicaid on any programs not specifically related to Medicaid or not authorized by the Legislature. Effective July 1, 2050. (SD1)	HMS/HTH, WAM
HB 1854, SD1 (SSCR2739) Testimony Status	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Removes unnecessary restrictions on the use of food distribution program revolving funds. Allows the use of food distribution program revolving funds to support the administration and operation of the food distribution program pursuant to 7 Code of Federal Regulations section 250.15. (SD1)	EDH, WAM
HB 2318, HD2, SD1 (SSCR2807) Testimony Status	RELATING TO THE HOMELESS. Establishes the housing first special fund. Authorizes the Hawaii public housing authority to implement housing first programs and services, as the authority deems appropriate for clientele who would most likely benefit and succeed from housing first programs, and subject to the availability of existing funds or housing first special fund moneys. Takes effect 7/1/2020 and sunsets 7/30/2016. (SD1)	EDH/HMS/WTL, WAM



HB 2306, HD2, SD1 (SSCR2798) Testimony	RELATING TO SALARIES. Adjusts compensation of the superintendent of education and state librarian by adding annual performance-based bonuses based on various evaluation criteria. Effective July 1, 2020. (SD1)	EDH, WAM
<u>Status</u> <u>HB 2377, HD3, SD1</u> (SSCR2805) <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Requires all voting members of the board of education to be appointed by the governor, with the advice and consent of the senate, from pools of qualified candidates presented to the governor by the board of education candidate nomination commission. Effective July 1, 2020. (SD1)	EDH, WAM
HB 2381, HD2, SD1 (SSCR2738) Testimony Status	RELATING TO TAXATION. Provides a temporary tax credit for residential construction and remodeling projects. Requires a report to the legislature comparing the impact on jobs and the state budget for various tax credit schemes. Effective 7/1/2020. Sunsets 6/30/2013. (SD1)	EDH, WAM
HB 2486, HD2, SD1 (SSCR2806) Testimony Status	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Establishes a minimum number of instructional days and hours per school year for kindergarten to grade twelve, beginning with the 2011- 2012 school year. Directs the department of education to consider pick-up and drop-off times that optimize the department's transportation services while minimizing costs. Effective July 1, 2020. (SD1)	EDH/LBR, WAM
<u>HB 1901, HD2, SD1</u> (SSCR2787) <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT OF VOTING SYSTEM EQUIPMENT. Establishes an alternative public procurement process for the procurement of voting system equipment. Effective upon approval and repealed on June 30, 2011. (SD1)	JGO, WAM
HB 2000, HD2, SD1 (SSCR2816) Testimony Status	RELATING TO THE JUDICIARY. Appropriates funds to the Judiciary for FY 2010-2011. (SD1)	JGO, WAM
HB 2595, HD1, SD1 (SSCR2786) Testimony Status	RELATING TO GENERAL EXCISE TAX. Precludes a taxpayer from using a general excise tax benefit, including exemptions, deductions, lower rates, or income splitting, unless the taxpayer follows all administrative requirements, subject to exemptions. Creates trust fund liability for revenues collected by a business as a tax recovery whether such amount is separately stated or not. Requires the department of taxation to conduct periodic reviews of housing projects certified for a general excise tax exemption. Clarifies that county housing projects are also entitled to tax exemptions under sections 237-29 and 238-3(j), HRS. Takes effect September 14, 2047. (SD1)	JGO, WAM



HB 415, HD2, SD1 (SSCR2761) Testimony Status	RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY. Directs the auditor to conduct a financial and management audit of the Department of Public Safety's contract with the Corrections Corporation of America and the federal detention center in Honolulu. Effective on approval. (SD1)	PSM, WAM
HB 1818, HD2, SD1 (SSCR2785) Testimony Status	RELATING TO COGNITIVE RESTRUCTURING. Allows the department of public safety to provide reentry/reintegration programs in Hawaii's correctional facilities offer cognitive behavioral theory with cultural and other interventions to address domestic violence, addictions, self-mastery through identity, and community connections for successful transitions back into the community. Effective on approval. (SD1)	PSM/WTL, WAM
HB 2266, HD1, SD1 (SSCR2760) Testimony Status	RELATING TO CORRECTIONS. Requires the Department of Public Safety to address sexual assault in prison. Requires the department to provide annual data regarding acts of sexual assault and sexual misconduct. Requires the department to report to the Legislature on any implementation of the federal Prison Rape Elimination Act. Effective upon approval. (SD1)	PSM, WAM
HB 2692, HD1 (SSCR2733) Testimony Status	RELATING TO DISASTER PREPAREDNESS PLANNING. Requires the director of civil defense to prepare a disaster preparedness plan for the 44th and 45th House of Representatives districts and report to the legislature in 2011. Effective July 1, 2020. (HB2692 HD1)	PSM, WAM
HB 2461, HD2, SD1 (SSCR2808) Testimony Status	RELATING TO INSURANCE. Requires a moratorium on the existing reference-based pricing program for prescription drug plan members through June 30, 2012; requires a study on the feasibility and long-term effects of reference- based pricing programs; requires pilot program to explore the use of mobile health vans; and provides for continuing coverage of prescription medication under any policy entered into by an insured or insurer on or after July 1, 2010. (SD1)	LBR/HMS/HTH, WAM
HB 2533, HD1, SD1 (SSCR2743) Testimony Status	RELATING TO THE EMPLOYMENT OF EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM RETIRANTS. Establishes conditions for reemployment of a retirant in a position that is excluded from Employee Retirement System (ERS) membership. Requires reimbursement of retirement allowances or other benefits received during the reemployment, and payment of contributions that should have been paid during the reemployment, for retirants reemployed in violation of the conditions for reemployment. Effective July 1, 2020. (SD1)	LBR, WAM
HB 2919, HD1, SD1 (SSCR2744) Testimony Status	RELATING TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM. Amends the definition of "sewer worker" for purposes of the Employees' Retirement System to include sewer maintenance working supervisors, wastewater collection system inspection supervisors, wastewater collection system district supervisors, and wastewater collection system field services supervisors. (SD1)	LBR, WAM



HB 40, HD1 (SSCR2727) Testimony	RELATING TO STATE BONDS. Repeals Act 112, Session Laws of Hawaii 2009, which authorized the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds to assist Carbon Diversion Inc. (HB40 HD1)	ENE, WAM
<u>Status</u> <u>HB 2239, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2728)</u> <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE DEPOSIT BEVERAGE CONTAINER PROGRAM. Removes the exemption for dietary supplements from the deposit beverage container program; adds hard spirits, and wine containers. (SD1)	ENE, WAM
HB 2497, SD1 (SSCR2729) Testimony Status	RELATING TO THE ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL PURPOSE REVENUE BONDS. Authorizes issuance of special purpose revenue bonds for Carbon Bio- Engineers Inc., for development of non-fossil fuel energy production. (SD1)	ENE, WAM
HB 2643, HD2, SD1 (SSCR2774) Testimony Status	RELATING TO CLEAN ENERGY BONDS. Establishes a clean energy bond loan program for renewable energy systems and energy efficiency improvements on residential and commercial properties; authorizes the issuance of general obligation reimbursable bonds to finance the program; establishes laws to implement the program which shall be repealed upon the adoption of administrative rules. (SD1)	ENE, WAM
HB 2644, HD2, SD1 (SSCR2741) Testimony Status	RELATING TO SOLID WASTE. Applies the solid waste disposal surcharge to waste that is deposited in a landfill, incinerator, or waste-to-energy facility, and applies the surcharge to waste that is shipped out-of-state for disposal. (SD1)	ENE/TIA, WAM
HB 2688, HD1, SD1 (SSCR2740) Testimony Status	RELATING TO HEALTH. Changes the name of the environmental health education fund to the sanitation and environmental health special fund and allows the funds to be used for sanitation program activities and functions; increases the amount that can be used for administrative costs and the amount that the fund may accumulate before the excess is transferred into the general fund. (SD1)	ENE/HTH, WAM
HB 2084, HD1, SD1 (SSCR2756) Testimony Status	RELATING TO THE FEDERAL DISPROPORTIONATE SHARE HOSPITAL FUNDS. Appropriates an unspecified amount to match the federal disproportionate share hospital allowance allocated to the State; authorizes a portion of the unspecified appropriated funds to be used to obtain matching federal disproportionate share hospital allowance for fiscal year 2009-2010 expenditures by the State. Effective July 1, 2050. (SD1)	HTH/HMS, WAM
HB 2094 (SSCR2755) Testimony Status	RELATING TO THE ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL PURPOSE REVENUE BONDS TO ASSIST HAWAII PACIFIC HEALTH. Authorizes the issuance of SPRBs to assist Hawaii Pacific Health in financing, refinancing, and/or reimbursing costs related to the acquisition or construction of health care facilities.	HTH, WAM



HB 2152, HD1, SD1 (SSCR2768) Testimony Status	RELATING TO BUILDING DESIGN FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES. Authorizes the disability and communication access board to charge a fee to defray expenses of review of construction plans to ensure compliance with laws relating to access to persons with disabilities. Establishes temporary fees until the board adopts permanent fees. Requires report to the legislature. (SD1)	HTH, WAM
HB 2505, HD1, SD1 (SSCR2802) Testimony Status	RELATING TO THE ACCESS HAWAII COMMITTEE. Establishes the access Hawaii committee special fund; requires information on income and expenditures to be subject to legislative review and oversight in each budget submittal from the department of accounting and general services. Effective July 1, 2020. (SD1)	EDT, WAM
HB 2698, HD2, SD1 (SSCR2777) Testimony Status	RELATING TO TECHNOLOGY. Requires the director of commerce and consumer affairs, in conjunction with expanded digital cable programming and services, to promote and encourage telework; establishes a telework promotion and broadband assistance advisory council; establishes a work group to develop procedures for streamlined permitting functions applicable to development of broadband services or technology; requires the department of commerce and consumer affairs to report annually to the legislature on expenditures of federal moneys for broadband facilities, services, equipment, or contracts. (SD1)	EDT, WAM
HB 2831, HD2, SD1 (SSCR2778) Testimony Status	RELATING TO THE NATURAL ENERGY LABORATORY OF HAWAII AUTHORITY. Authorizes the natural energy laboratory of Hawaii authority (NELHA) to acquire, hold, and sell qualified securities subject to certain conditions; authorizes NELHA to accept donations of money, property, and services; requires NELHA to report on these matters in the NELHA annual report. (SD1)	EDT, WAM
HB 2783, HD2, SD1 (SSCR2813) Testimony Status	RELATING TO GENERAL EXCISE TAX. Makes permanent the general excise tax exemptions for condominium common expenses paid by managers, submanagers, and suboperators, and for hotel employee expenses paid by hotel operators and timeshare projects. Clarifies the maximum allowable tax exemption. (SD1)	CPN/TSM, WAM
HB 2923, HD2, SD1 (SSCR2819) Testimony Status	RELATING TO PUBLIC LANDS. Established procedures for the department of Hawaiian home lands for purpose of determining the disposition of lands for commercial and multipurpose projects. Limits extension of leases to not longer than twenty years, to be granted only once. Specifies disposition of proceeds. Requires DHHL to submit annual report to legislature and the U.S. Dept. of Interior. Specifies twenty percent of revenues generated from lease agreements and land use instruments to be deposited into the Native Hawaiian rehabilitation fund. Eff 7/1/2010. (SD1)	WTL, WAM
HB 2667, HD2 (SSCR2712) Testimony Status	RELATING TO FERRIES. Requires the Department of Transportation to conduct a study on the feasibility of establishing a statewide ferry system and the Hawaii State Ferry System Authority for the operation of a ferry system between the islands. Effective July 1, 2020. (HB2667 HD2)	TIA, WAM
