Establishes the crime of intentional or knowing taking of a Hawaiian

## RELATING TO SMALL BOAT HARBORS.

**WLO** 

Requires small boat harbor commercial vessel permittees who, in the course of providing an excursion between state boating facilities, disembark fare-paying passengers with the expectation that they will enter upon any public or quasi-public real property during the course of their excursion, to comply with all rules and regulations applicable to these areas. Effective 7/1/50. (SD1)
