| <u>SB 2500</u> <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS. Requires the State auditor to conduct a financial and management audit of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs, and to issue a report on or before the convening of the 2011 legislative session. | WTL, WAM |
| <u>SB 2301</u> <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS. Transfers the functions and duties of the historic preservation division of DLNR relating to Hawaiian burial sites to the Office of Hawaiian Affairs. | WTL, WAM |
| <u>SB 2302</u> <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS. Transfers the functions and duties of the historic preservation division and the Kaho`olawe island reserve commission relating to Hawaiian burial sites to the Office of Hawaiian Affairs. Establishes special fund. Funds operation through conveyance tax revenues. Includes cave burials and burial sites. | WTL, WAM |
| <u>SB 2524</u> <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO ISLAND BURIAL COUNCILS. Authorizes the governor to waive the requirements that the Molokai island burial council membership include geographic region, development, and large property owner representatives. | WTL |
| <u>SB 2409</u> <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO MARINE LIFE CONSERVATION DISTRICTS. Requires that any conditions on permits issued for the taking of marine life or boating and coastal activities in marine life conservation districts shall be adopted pursuant to administrative procedures. | WTL |
