HB 674, HD1 (HSCR487-10) Testimony Status	RELATING TO HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS. Amends the operating budget of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs and the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands for fiscal years 2009-2010 and 2010-2011. Effective July 1, 2020. (HB674 HD1)	WTL, WAM

HB 2832, HD1 (HSCR503-10) Testimony Status	RELATING TO TARO SECURITY. Authorizes the Office of Hawaiian Affairs to seek funding for projects that increase the cultivation and use of taro. Effective July 1, 2020. (HB2832 HD1)	WTL, WAM
HB 2582 (HSCR653-10) Testimony Status	RELATING TO VESSELS AT ALA WAI AND KEEHI BOAT HARBORS. Authorizes moorage for commercial vessels and commercial vessel activities in the Ala Wai and Keehi Boat Harbors and adjusts fees for permittees of vessels that are used for a place of principal habitation in state small boat harbors.	WTL, WAM
HB 2741, HD1 (HSCR502-10) Testimony Status	RELATING TO SMALL BOAT HARBORS. Requires a permittee of certain commercial fishing vessels to pay a fee two times the moorage fee of a recreational vessel. Allows a person to transfer stock or interest in a corporation or business entity operating a commercial fishing vessel while allowing the corporation or business entity to retain its mooring permit under certain circumstances. Defines "commercial fishing activity." Effective July 1, 2020. (HB2741 HD1)	WTL, WAM



HB 1684, HD2 (HSCR198-10) Testimony Status	RELATING TO INVASIVE SPECIES. Prevents and reduces the intentional introduction and spread of invasive species by establishing and revising penalties appropriate to the harm caused by the intentional introduction and spread of invasive species to the economy, natural environment, and the health and lifestyle of Hawaii's people. (HB1684 HD2)	WTL, JGO
HB 2290, HD2 (HSCR559-10) Testimony Status	RELATING TO AGRICULTURE. Establishes the Agriculture Inspection and Certification Special Fund under the Department of Agriculture for the inspection, certification, weighing, or grading of agricultural commodities that are to be imported into, exported from, or shipped within the state. Deposits all fees, civil penalties, and other moneys collected by DOA into the Special Fund. Allows DOA to enter into agreements with government and private agencies to hire and pay inspectors to perform certification and audit services, maintain food safety, and establish and maintain an Internet food safety promotional and reporting system. Repeals the Certification Services Revolving Fund. Requires the establishment or increase of certain fees to cover the operation and maintenance costs of agriculture inspection and certification programs, and central services and departmental administrative expense assessments. Appropriates funds for DOA's agriculture inspection and certification program. Effective July 1, 2020. (HB2290 HD2)	WTL, WAM
HB 2775, HD2 (HSCR654-10) Testimony Status	RELATING TO AGRICULTURE. Establishes fees for processing of permits, letters, and the registration of plants, animals, and microorganisms allowed entry into the state. Effective July 1, 2020. (HB2775 HD2)	WTL, WAM
