SB 2169, SD2 RELATING TO SHARK FINS.

(SSCR2566) Prohibits the possession, sale, and distribution of shark fins in the Status State; repeals the ban on the practice of shark finning. Effective date

SB 2409 RELATING TO MARINE LIFE CONSERVATION DISTRICTS. EBM, WLO, JUD (SSCR2384) Requires that any conditions on permits issued for the taking of marine

life or boating and coastal activities in marine life conservation districts shall be adopted pursuant to administrative procedures.

SB 2625, SD2 RELATING TO OUT-OF-STATE OFFICES. EBM, LMG, FIN

Beginning July 1, 2010, requires at least every two years an audit of the department of business, economic development, and tourism's out-of-state offices; repeals exemption from audit and accounting requirements for out-of-state offices; beginning February 1, 2010, requires the department to cease expending or transferring any remaining federal reimbursement market development cooperator program funds; requires the department to update policies and procedures of the out-of-state offices; requires the state procurement office to review financial records of the 2005 trade mission; requires

reports to the legislature.
