INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTIONS

The following concurrent resolution (H.C.R. No. 3) was announced by the Clerk and was disposed of as follows:

H.C.R. No. 3, entitled: "HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION AWARDING THE HAWAII MEDAL OF HONOR TO UNITED STATES MILITARY SERVICE MEMBERS, WITH HAWAII CONNECTIONS, KILLED IN ACTION WHILE SERVING IN DANGEROUS, VOLATILE, AND UNSTABLE AREAS OF THE WORLD, INCLUDING IRAQ AND AFGHANISTAN," was offered by Representative Say.

Representative B. Oshiro moved that H.C.R. No. 3 be adopted, seconded by Representative Finnegan.

Representative Takai rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"It has been almost seven years since the War on Terrorism began, and while there continues to be much debate about this war, there's no debate about the tremendous sacrifices made by our service members and their families. Between March 29, 2003 and January 15th of this year, we in Hawaii have lost 268 service members, who have all sacrificed their lives while in the line of duty. We lost a total of 28 service members this past year and to pay special tribute to these heroes and to their families, we passed House Bill 8 in 2005, which became Act 21. House Bill 8 created the Hawaii Medal of Honor.

"This special medal is awarded on behalf of the people of the State of Hawaii to an individual who has been killed in action while serving our country as part of Operation Iraqi Freedom or Operation Enduring Freedom. Recipients of the Hawaii Medal of Honor include members of the United States Armed Forces, the United States Military Reserves, and the Hawaii National Guard, who are residents of the State of Hawaii, attended an education institution in Hawaii, who were stationed in Hawaii by order of the United States Department of Defense.

"By this Concurrent Resolution, Mr. Speaker, this year's Hawaii Medal of Honor will be awarded to family representatives of these fine men and women at a ceremony held during a Joint Session of the Legislature on Tuesday, March 23rd, 2010 at 2 p.m., in this Chamber. Families will be invited from towns like Yonkers, New York and Homestead, Florida, to as far as Koror, Palau to attend this ceremony.

"In 2004 to 2005, Mr. Speaker, the 29th Brigade Combat Team from our very own Hawaii Army National Guard, along with the 100th Battalion from the Army Reserves deployed. During that period we lost 17 members of our Brigade. In this last deployment in 2008 which ended around August of 2009, we lost another three members for a total of 20.

"I'd like to mention some information for our Members about the three people that we lost during this past deployment. Sergeant Julian Manglona was recognized in last year's ceremony, Mr. Speaker. Corporal Casey Hills will be recognized in this year's ceremony, and Specialist Cwislyn Walter will also be recognized in this year's ceremony.

"Finally, Mr. Speaker, although I wasn't here last year, I do believe that this medal ceremony is very important, not only to us, but to the entire State of Hawaii. And I'd like to at this time thank everybody for continuing this tradition. I would also like to recognize certain people, in particular. First, Lisa Vargas from my office who has held this medal ceremony together since its inception. I'd also like to thank Speaker Say and Chairman Ito. It is because of them that in 2005 that we actually are here today, recognizing these individuals. And finally, Mr. Speaker, Chairman McKelvey for his work as Chairman of the Committee, as well as the Clerk's Office and Sergeant-at-Arms for doing such a great job this past year. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Ward rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"May I also stand in strong support of this with a very brief comment? First, to thank the previous speaker for all his hard work as the progenitor of this, and the mover and the shaker of what otherwise is probably one of the proudest moments that Hawaii has for its veterans and for the families.

"I would only end with one suggestion to make it even better, Mr. Speaker, and that is we cry with the family members as they come up to receive their rewards and their awards. But as we go to the functions thereafter I would suggest we have an escort or an assigned or an adopted family type thing so when they're sitting there eating, they're not all alone. I think that will help personalize what otherwise is probably one of the most excellent things that any state has ever done for any veteran. Thank you."

Representative McKelvey rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. In strong support. I'd just like to have the words of the two previous speakers entered in the Journal as if they were my own. Thank you very much," and the Chair "so ordered." (By reference only.)

Representative Cabanilla rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I also rise in strong support of the Resolution and I would like the words of my colleague from Pearl City to be entered into the record as if they were my own. Thank you," and the Chair "so ordered." (By reference only.)

Vice Speaker Magaoay then stated:

"Also a comment from the Chair to Representative Mark Takai. Thank you very much for serving our country last year. You were missed, but now you're back and hopefully you will be here for a whole duration. But again, thank you for serving our country. Thank you."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and H.C.R. No. 3 was adopted.
