The first day of December, or the month of February, forever. And I've asked them if they could provide us some guidance later.

"That's not to say this is not worthy. I think it's very much worthy. But I do believe that for resolutions, the effective date of the resolution typically ends when we end as a Legislature. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

H.C.R. No. 68, entitled: "HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING THE FIRST DAY OF DECEMBER OF EVERY YEAR AS WORLD'S AIDS DAY IN THE STATE OF HAWAII," was adopted, with Representatives Aquino, Hanohano, Har, M. Oshiro, Sagum and Souki being excused.

H.R. No. 34, HD 1:

Oshiro, Sagum and Souki being excused.

H.R. No. 40 and H.C.R. No. 89:

Representative B. Oshiro moved that H.R. No. 40, and H.C.R. No. 89, be adopted, seconded by Representative Evans.

Representative Ching rose to speak in support of both measures, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I rise in strong support of these two measures, House Resolution 40 and House Concurrent Resolution 89. Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I won't go into my usual, I guess 'song and dance' or factoids on what I've mentioned earlier, about Hawaii being the only state that can grow chocolate. I won't go into all of that because I've already done it.

"But just a week or so ago, I will say that on the second page of the local newspaper came this article, 'Sweet Chocolate Good For the Heart.' It says here that a study out of Germany, in fact the German Institute of Human Nutrition, the study's lead author Brian Buijsse, came out with that indeed people who had an average of just... now of course with all good things, too much can be too much. So it's just a little bit of chocolate. Had an average of six grams of chocolate a day, about one square of chocolate bar, and it has to be dark chocolate, had a 39% lower risk of heart attack or stroke. This study will be published today, so that was a week ago in the European Heart Journal.

"Flavonoids, which are also found in vegetables and in red wine, help the muscles and blood vessels to widen, which leads to a drop in blood pressure. So this is something that I know the cacao people have been talking about for a long time. People do eat raw cacao at health food stores, but that's just one of the many reasons why I think it's a good ag product to support. And in particular with our proximity to Asia and their ever increasing demand for high-end chocolate. Only high-end chocolate. Thank you."

Representative Ward rose, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, will my colleague accept a cacao question?"

Representative Ching responded, stating:

"Always. I will try my best to answer any question."

Representative Ward: "You mentioned, one square per day of dark chocolate. How dark does it have to be? Because my wife warned me about the milk chocolate, the content. How dark does it have to be? This is serious stuff."

Representative Ching: "No, it is. I'm not a scientist, but what we consider dark chocolate, and you'll see this in all of the new bars you'll see in Starbucks and other places that have artisan chocolate. I believe it would be 70% or higher. Of course at 90%, it's not very tasty, I have to warn you. At 90%, you don't taste too much of the sugar content. I think, but I can get back to you. Thank you."

Representative McKelvey rose to speak in support of both measures, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. In strong support. And may I have the words of the previous speaker, minus the answer to the question, placed into the record as if they were my own," and the Chair "so ordered." (By reference only.)

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and H.R. No. 40, entitled: "HOUSE RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING FEBRUARY AS 'HAWAII-GROWN CACAO MONTH'," was adopted, with Representatives Aquino, Hanohano, Har, M. Oshiro, Sagum and Souki being excused; and

H.C.R. No. 89, entitled: "HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING FEBRUARY AS 'HAWAII-GROWN CACAO MONTH'," was adopted, with Representatives Aquino, Hanohano, Har, M. Oshiro, Sagum and Souki being excused.

On motion by Representative B. Oshiro, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.R. No. 227, entitled: "HOUSE RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING TRADITIONAL HAWAIIAN TATTOOING AS AN ART FORM," was referred to the Committee on Tourism, Culture, & International Affairs, with Representatives Aquino, Hanohano, Har, M. Oshiro, Sagum and Souki being excused.

Representative Carroll, for the Committee on Hawaiian Affairs presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1241-10), recommending that H.R. No. 54, as amended in HD 1, be referred to the Committee on Tourism, Culture, & International Affairs.

On motion by Representative B. Oshiro, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.R. No. 54, HD 1, entitled: "HOUSE RESOLUTION EXPRESSING SUPPORT FOR, AND URGING PARTICIPATION IN, THE 6TH HEALING OUR SPIRIT WORLDWIDE GATHERING," was referred to the Committee on Tourism, Culture, & International Affairs, with Representatives Aquino, Hanohano, Har, M. Oshiro, Sagum and Souki being excused.

Representative Carroll, for the Committee on Hawaiian Affairs presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1242-10), recommending that H.R. No. 246, be referred to the Committee on Water, Land, & Ocean Resources.

On motion by Representative B. Oshiro, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.R. No. 246, entitled: "HOUSE RESOLUTION URGING THE COUNTIES TO ADOPT NATIVE HAWAIIAN BUILDING CODES," was referred to the Committee on Water, Land, & Ocean Resources, with Representatives Aquino, Hanohano, Har, M. Oshiro, Sagum and Souki being excused.

Representative Carroll, for the Committee on Hawaiian Affairs presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1243-10), recommending that H.R. No. 172, as amended in HD 1, be referred to the Committee on Water, Land, & Ocean Resources.

Representative B. Oshiro moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that H.R. No. 172, HD 1, be referred to the Committee on Water, Land, & Ocean Resources, seconded by Representative Evans.

Representative Ward rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Mr. Speaker. I rise in support with slight reservations. This is a very worthy resolution. It's deserving of passage, but essentially it puts a taro field on the Capitol lawn. I'm not sure which side it is, or where it is, but the way the wording of the resolution is, it's saying to OHA to do it, rather than to also process it, and be sensitive to the protocol. I mention that because of the extreme amount of consensus building that the veterans for the Vietnam and Korean Memorial had to go through in order to do that.

"So this implies that, if it's not changed, that it's already a *fait accompli* and if the next Committee could look at that and say somehow, getting the permissions and the processes because when anything is put into law, there's a lot of people who want to have buy-in. A lot of people want to put their *mana* into it. So with that Mr. Speaker, I'm supporting it, but I suggest it be tweaked to be a little bit better. Thank you."

Representative Ching rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I stand in support with again, just slight reservations. You know, *lo'i* are so important to our heritage of Hawaii, but

I do know that there's a Hawaii Capitol Cultural District and there's a coalition that have been working for decades on this area. I'm just hoping that in coordination, that they're also considered, and all of the meaning that comes with the State Capitol is integrated.

"It sounds like a wonderful idea, but we want to make sure that there's a lot of thought put into this State Capitol's architecture and of course a *lo'i* more than likely match, but there's so many people that have been involved for many decades. Thank you."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.R. No. 172, HD 1, entitled: "HOUSE RESOLUTION REQUESTING THAT A LO'I BE ESTABLISHED ON THE GROUNDS OF THE STATE CAPITOL," was referred to the Committee on Water, Land, & Ocean Resources, with Representatives Aquino, Hanohano, Har, M. Oshiro, Sagum and Souki being excused.

Representative Carroll, for the Committee on Hawaiian Affairs presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1244-10), recommending that H.R. No. 251, as amended in HD 1, be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Representative B. Oshiro moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that H.R. No. 251, HD 1, be referred to the Committee on Judiciary, seconded by Representative Evans.

Representative Awana rose to disclose a potential conflict of interest, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. May I have a ruling on a possible conflict? Thank you. I'm both Native Hawaiian and a Hawaiian homestead lessee. Thank you," and the Chair ruled, "no conflict."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.R. No. 251, HD 1, entitled: "HOUSE RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS TO EXPLORE OPPORTUNITIES TO REVISE ITS PRESENT POLICIES ON MATTERS OF SUCCESSIONSHIP," was referred to the Committee on Judiciary, with Representatives Aquino, Hanohano, Har, M. Oshiro, Sagum and Souki being excused.

Representative Karamatsu, for the Committee on Judiciary presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1245-10) recommending that S.C.R. No. 38, SD 1, be adopted.

Representative B. Oshiro moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that S.C.R. No. 38, SD 1, be adopted, seconded by Representative Evans.

Representative Marumoto rose in support of the measure and asked that her written remarks be inserted in the Journal, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Marumoto's written remarks are as follows:

"Chief Justice Ronald T. K. Moon has served Hawaii's people his entire legal career. From his days in private practice, through being a law clerk, deputy prosecutor, Circuit Court Judge and a member of the Hawaii Supreme Court, Chief Justice Moon has been an exemplary public servant and has worked tirelessly for greater access to the judicial system for all of Hawaii's citizens. He has also been a leader and role model for members of the Korean-American community in Hawaii. Renaming the Kapolei Judicial Complex for Chief Justice Moon would honor his lifetime achievements."

Representative Ching rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Thank you. I am also in strong support. Chief Justice has always been, I think, a pillar of our community. I know he pushed for this, and I'd like to add additional remarks in the Journal."

Representative Ching's written remarks are as follows:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I rise in support of S.C.R. 38, which recommends that the Kapolei Court Complex be renamed the "Ronald T.Y. Moon Judicial Complex".

"Ronald T.Y. Moon devoted more than four decades to serving Hawaii's judiciary, first as a law clerk to the United States District Court, then as a deputy prosecutor, a Circuit Court Judge, and as a distinguished member of Hawaii's Supreme Court. Amongst Chief Justice Moon's many accomplishments, he has created programs such as the Hawaii Appellate Mediation Program and the Access to Justice Commissions. He has openly supported the pro bono service or lawyers and has been honored by the National Center for State Courts with that organization's Distinguished Service Award for longstanding contributions to the improvement of the justice system.

"His readiness and availability to our community is seen in his association with the efforts to increase access to the judicial system, especially for traditionally underserved communities around the island.

"Recently some allegations have been made regarding Chief Justice Moon and as I have not had the chance to research the latest attacks that have been made, I stand behind what I have experienced of him and pride he engenders in the community. Thank you."

Representative Saiki rose in opposition to the measure and asked that his written remarks be inserted in the Journal, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Saiki's written remarks are as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise in opposition to this measure notwithstanding my high regard for the Chief Justice and the Senate President, who introduced this measure.

"I spoke with the Senate President a few days ago to inform her of my opposition to this resolution. I explained to her that this resolution is premature, particularly since it requests that the Kapolei Judiciary complex be named after a sitting judge. I believe that a structure should be named after a person whose legacy is enduring and has withstood the test of time. With respect to a Judiciary structure, the test should consist of at least three criteria:

1. Whether the individual has advanced the rule of law in Hawaii, both in judicial and non-judicial capacities;
2. Whether the individual has increased public confidence in our judicial system; and
3. Whether the individual has furthered justice and public access within our judicial system.

"I do not believe that the Legislature is in the best position to evaluate these criteria. Accordingly, I respectfully oppose this resolution. Thank you, very much."
