The House of Representatives of the Twenty-Fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, convened at 11:41 o'clock a.m., with the Speaker presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Mr. Gordon Chang, uncle of Representative Chang, after which the Roll was called showing all Members present with the exception of Representatives Har, Luke, Shimabukuro and Souki, who were excused.

By unanimous consent, reading and approval of the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Fiftieth Day was deferred.

Representative B. Oshiro moved that the House reconsider its action previously taken pursuant to the recommendation contained in Standing Committee Report No. 1354-10, recommending referral to the Committee on Finance seconded by Representative Evans and carried. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

S.C.R. No. 206, SD 1:

Representative B. Oshiro moved that S.C.R. No. 206, SD 1, be adopted, seconded by Representative Evans.

Representative Awana rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I'd just like to stand in strong support. Thank you."

Representative Pine rose to disclose a potential conflict of interest, stating:

"I just want a ruling on a potential conflict. I've worked with the Waianae Coast Homeless Task Force," and the Chair ruled, "no conflict."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and S.C.R. No. 206, SD 1, entitled: "SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE WAIANAE COAST HOMELESSNESS TASK FORCE TO DEVELOP A COMPREHENSIVE PLAN TO ADDRESS THE IMMEDIATE, SHORT-, AND LONG-TERM NEEDS OF THE HOMELESS AND THOSE AT-RISK OF BECOMING HOMELESS," was adopted, with Representatives Har, Luke, Shimabukuro and Souki being excused.

STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS

Representatives Cabanilla and Ito, for the Committee on Housing and the Committee on Water, Land, & Ocean Resources presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1356-10) recommending that S.C.R. No. 93, SD 1, as amended in HD 1, be adopted.

Representative B. Oshiro moved that the report of the Committees be adopted, and that S.C.R. No. 93, SD 1, HD 1, be adopted, seconded by Representative Evans.

Representative Ching rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I rise with just some reservations. I'd like to read if you don't mind, from the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Corporation testimony from Karen Seddon. It says here that: '... the HHFDC opposes SCR 93 because it is not able to undertake the review due to budgetary constraints, the hiring freeze, and the considerable amount of compliance and reporting obligations of the HHFDC now incurred since its receipt of the federal stimulus funds.' It believes that the single room occupancy dwellings can be an important part of the solution in lack of affordable housing.

"However, noted in 2009, the City and County Department of Planning and Permitting testified it was already actively preparing for the transit-oriented development with neighborhood plans, subsequent zoning, financial mechanisms to guide the private sector towards meeting those adopted community values and opportunities, and that affordable housing will be one of the topics studied. So with that Mr. Speaker, I have reservations."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committees was adopted and S.C.R. No. 93, SD 1, HD 1, entitled: "SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE HAWAII HOUSING FINANCE AND DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION TO REVIEW THE FEASIBILITY OF DEVELOPING SINGLE ROOM OCCUPANCY DWELLINGS IN TRANSIT ORIENTED DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS TO ALLEVIATE THE AFFORDABLE HOUSING SHORTAGE," was adopted, with Representatives Har, Luke, Mizuno, Shimabukuro and Souki being excused.

No. 128, entitled: "SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION ENCOURAGING ALL PUBLIC AND PRIVATE EMPLOYERS IN THIS STATE TO USE E-VERIFY TO CONFIRM EMPLOYEE WORKPLACE ELIGIBILITY," was referred to the Committee on Judiciary, with Representatives Har, Luke, Mizuno, Shimabukuro and Souki being excused.

Representative Rhoads, for the Committee on Labor & Public Employment presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1360-10), recommending that S.C.R. No. 201, be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

On motion by Representative B. Oshiro, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.C.R. No. 201, entitled: "SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS TO ADOPT RULES TO PROHIBIT ABUSIVE WORK ENVIRONMENTS," was referred to the Committee on Judiciary, with Representatives Har, Luke, Mizuno, Shimabukuro and Souki being excused.

Representative Rhoads, for the Committee on Labor & Public Employment presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1361-10), recommending that S.C.R. No. 144, SD 1, be referred to the Committee on Finance.

On motion by Representative B. Oshiro, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.C.R. No. 144, SD 1, entitled: "SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS TO MEET OR EXCEED OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH ADMINISTRATION POSITION BENCHMARKS FOR WORKPLACE SAFETY AND HEALTH AND CONDUCT A STUDY

TO DETERMINE THE FEASIBILITY OF IMPLEMENTING A CONSTRUCTION SAFETY AND HEALTH PROGRAM IN THE STATE," was referred to the Committee on Finance, with Representatives Har, Luke, Mizuno, Shimabukuro and Souki being excused.

Representative McKelvey, for the Committee on Conference on the disagreeing vote of the House to the amendments proposed by the Senate in H.B. No. 1900, SD 1, presented a report (Conf. Com. Rep. No. 6-10) recommending that H.B. No. 1900, SD 1, as amended in CD 1, pass Final Reading.

In accordance with Article III, Section 15, of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii, action on Conf. Com. Rep. No. 6-10 and H.B. No. 1900, SD 1, CD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO MILITARY PERSONNEL," was deferred for a period of 48 hours.

Representatives Takumi, Karamatsu and M. Oshiro, for the Committee on Conference on the disagreeing vote of the House to the amendments proposed by the Senate in H.B. No. 2376, HD 3, SD 2, presented a report (Conf. Com. Rep. No. 7-10) recommending that H.B. No. 2376, HD 3, SD 2, as amended in CD 1, pass Final Reading.

In accordance with Article XVII, Section 3, of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii, action on Conf. Com. Rep. No. 7-10 and H.B. No. 2376, HD 3, SD 2, CD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT PROPOSING AMENDMENTS TO THE HAWAII CONSTITUTION RELATING TO THE BOARD OF EDUCATION," was deferred for a period of 10 days.

Representatives M. Oshiro and Karamatsu, for the Committee on Conference on the disagreeing vote of the Senate to the amendments proposed by the House in S.B. No. 2807, SD 2, HD 2, presented a report (Conf. Com. Rep. No. 54-10) recommending that S.B. No. 2807, SD 2, HD 2, as amended in CD 1, pass Final Reading.

In accordance with Article XVII, Section 3, of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii, action on Conf. Com. Rep. No. 54-10 and S.B. No. 2807, SD 2, HD 2, CD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE VII, SECTION 6, OF THE HAWAII CONSTITUTION, RELATING TO THE TAX REBATE REQUIREMENT," was deferred for a period of 10 days.

At this time, the Chair addressed Representative Coffman, stating:

"Yes Mr. Speaker, these are all constitutional amendments and require 10 day notice."

Speaker Say: "Correct. Thank you, very much."

FINAL READING

Representative B. Oshiro moved to agree to the amendments made by the Senate to the following House Bill, seconded by Representative Evans and carried: (Representatives Har, Luke, Shimabukuro and Souki were excused.)

H.B. No. 2351, (SD 1)

H.B. No. 2351, SD 1:

Representative B. Oshiro moved that H.B. No. 2351, SD 1, pass Final Reading, seconded by Representative Evans.

Representative Yamane rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I'm standing in strong support. Mr. Speaker, House Bill 2351 corrects the oversight that individuals who receive a less than honorable discharge or a general discharge under honorable conditions are not able to receive veteran's license plates.

"Mr. Speaker, this bill will honor veterans. I am not a veteran, but being a veteran is an honor earned by honorably supporting and protecting your country, Mr. Speaker. This will allow veteran's license plates to be a public declaration of service in an honorable way. So I would highly recommend the passage of this measure. Thank you."

Representative McKelvey rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. In strong support and may I have the words of the previous speaker entered in the record as if they were my own. Thank you."

Representative Takai rose in support of the measure and asked that the remarks of Representative Yamane be entered into the Journal as his own and asked that his written remarks be inserted in the Journal, and the Chair "so ordered." (By reference only.)

Representative Takai's written remarks are as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, I speak in support of this bill. The purpose of this measure is to require veterans who submit application for veteran's license plates to provide the most recent discharge document that indicates an honorable discharge from the military.

"Veteran license plates identify individuals who have served this country. The veteran community and the general public believe that individuals who fail to meet certain standards of behavior and who received a less than honorable discharge should not be recognized as a veteran

"The law, as currently written, allows those with less than an honorable discharge to receive a veteran's license plate. This measure corrects that oversight. For these reasons, I support this measure and urge my colleagues to do the same. Thank you."

Representative Ward rose in support of the measure and asked that the remarks of Representative Yamane be entered into the Journal as his own and asked that his written remarks be inserted in the Journal, and the Chair "so ordered." (By reference only.)

Representative Ward's written remarks are as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, I am presenting written comments in support of HB2351, which requires an applicant for a veteran's license plate to include a copy of the applicant's most recent discharge paper or separation document that indicates an honorable discharge or general (under honorable conditions) discharge from active duty.

"As a veteran of the Vietnam War and a member of the Veterans' Caucus, I find it imperative that we protect the integrity of veterans' license

plates. To be publicly identified as a veteran is an incredible honor, and it should be reserved for those who truly deserve it. Requiring proof of honorable discharge is a simple step we can take to show our appreciation for our country's veterans.

"For these reasons, Mr. Speaker, I strongly support HB2351."

Representative Cabanilla rose to disclose a potential conflict of interest, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, may I have a ruling on a possible conflict. I'm a veteran," and the Chair ruled, "no conflict."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and H.B. No. 2351, SD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO VETERANS," passed Final Reading by a vote of 47 ayes, with Representatives Har, Luke, Shimabukuro and Souki being excused.

At 11:55 o'clock a.m., the Chair noted that the following bill passed Final Reading:
