Mr. Speaker, I can't think of a more deserving nation, a more scientifically, entrepreneurially based nation and the future model for the \$1.3 billion Chinese who look very, very closely at Taiwan so this would be a great step in the right direction. Thank you."

Representative Ward's written remarks are as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, I am presenting written comments in strong support of SCR No.126, which urges the United Nations to grant Taiwan meaningful participation in the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO). Taiwan is a major transport hub in Asia, and the Taipei Flight Information Region accounts for over forty million passengers and 1,580,000 metric tons of cargo each year.

"Taiwan's exclusion from the ICAO since 1971 has made it extremely difficult for Taiwan to remain informed and updated on international aviation standards and norms. Taiwan's participation in the ICAO is therefore imperative to ensure the integrity of international air safety and security and to promote cultural exchange, business, trade, and tourism.

"Taiwan's meaningful participation in the International Civil Aviation Organization will benefit not only Taiwan, but also the entire international community. For these reasons, Mr. Speaker, I strongly support SCR No. 126"

Representative Chang rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"I support the motion."

Representative Chong rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"In support."

Representative Ching rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"In strong support."

Representative Cabanilla rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"In strong support, Mr. Speaker. I would like the words of the Representative from Hawaii Kai, as well as the Representative from Hilo to be entered into the Journal as if they were my own."

Representative Yamane rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I stand in strong support."

Representative B. Oshiro rose in support of the measure and asked that his written remarks be inserted in the Journal, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative B. Oshiro written remarks are as follows:

"I am in strong support of this measure, which urges the United Nations to grant Taiwan meaningful participation in the activities, meetings, and mechanisms of the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO).

"As reflected in this measure, and elsewhere, Taiwan has a burgeoning economy - a reflection of its investment in technology, infrastructure, and an overall strong entrepreneurial business climate. In addition, the country's geographic location makes it an economic and cultural crossroads between many East Asian countries, which is why its inclusion in the ICAO is so important.

"Having visited Taipei, I know firsthand the importance this organization plays in Taiwan's future economic development, which is why I urge my colleagues to support this measure."
