Lessons Learned

Federal

- from executing on funds until resolved Federal agencies will often make conditional awards; conditions prevent state
- NEPA, Davis-Bacon, and Buy American requirements and their implementation have been significant impediments to execution
- Federal interpretation of statutes varies and causes delays
- Webinars for programs, reporting, and compliance have been very helpful
- Federal staff shortage resulted in delays in feedback to state's questions and delay of approvals
- Fed Connect needs a Table of Contents and an Index to facilitate finding subject area answers...not user friendly

State

- Having staff experienced with Federal grants necessary not sufficient for success; ARRA brought a significant learning curve even for seasoned staff
- Implementation of early awards delayed due to evolution of requirements
- Capacity issues needed to be addressed to be able to execute energy programs; entailed creating new positions and hiring new staff
- reporting and application Ensure registration with Federal grants system well in advance to facilitate
