Mahalo nui loa for allowing me the opportunity to submit my testimony for your consideration.



Dear Chair Baker and Senate Members:

I am Darryl D. Perry, Chief of Police for Kauai County, and I come before this body seeking confirmation as a member of the Board of Private Detectives and Guards.
