Testimony Before The Senate Committee On Human Services

Jo Ann D. Koga

February 25, 2010

Chair Oakland, members of the Human Services Committee, thank you for this opportunity to present background about myself in your consideration of my confirmation to the Statewide Independent Living Council.

I was born and raised on O'ahu and have lived in Honolulu much of my adult life. I attended Punahou School, Kaimuki High School, and completed high school in Washington State. I attended the University of Washington where I received a Bachelor of Science degree in Biology. Currently I am attending the University of Hawai'i at Manoa as a candidate in the Master's in Rehabilitation Counselor Education program. I will complete my studies in 2011.

My own personal experience with the independent living movement began in 1997 when I became a resident in a transitional home for people with disabilities. After three years there I moved to my own apartment. I successfully re-established myself in the independent way of life that echoed the life I had previous to my disability. I subsequently married and now live with my husband.

Many of my friends and acquaintances in the disability community were not as fortunate as I was in finding transitional and independent living services. The myriad obstacles that people with disabilities face in trying to attain independent living are not a part of the average person's life. Until my own personal experience with disability, I had very little knowledge of these obstacles or of the assistance that might be available.

I believe that implementing the statewide plan for independent living begins with educating the people of Hawai'i about the need for independent living services. Within our pool of resources, we need to find ways to overcome the financial and social barriers to appropriate housing for people with disabilities.

If we can achieve our dream for independent living, then we will all benefit from building a community where we can live in dignity and with respect for each other. I would like to help this dream become reality by being appointed to the Statewide Independent Living Council.

I welcome the many challenges ahead. My character, background, education and experience qualify me to be effective and successful in this area. I humbly ask for you to support my nomination to the Statewide Independent Living Council. Thank you.
