I support HB 2056, which recognizes that relevant and beneficial pharmacy practice experiences (counting towards practical experience requirements for licensure) occur in locations other than just the traditional pharmacy settings. The Act also adds practice experience rotations performed in the District of Columbia and United States territories, in addition to such experience that is currently limited to the 50 states.
