I am testifying on behalf of Western States Petroleum Association (known as WSPA) in opposition to HB 2131. WSPA is a non-profit trade association representing a broad spectrum of petroleum industry companies in Hawaii and five other western states.

HB 2131 would require retail service stations to provide customers who purchase motor vehicle fuel with free access to potable water. WSPA cannot support HB 2131 in its current form for the reasons cited below:

- Requirements would be financially burdensome for operators at some locations that would require capital improvements in order to become compliant.
- If law were adopted, it needs to be applied across all facilities transacting with the public in order to avoid market distortions that could place some retailers at a competitive disadvantage.
- Law is vague as to what constitutes compliance.
- Law does not allow flexibility for those attempting to meet compliance.
