My name is Barbara Kim Stanton, State Director of AARP Hawaii. AARP is a membership organization of people 50 and older with 150,000 members in Hawaii. We are committed to championing access to affordable, quality health care for all generations, providing the tools needed to save for retirement, and serving as a reliable information source on issues critical to Americans age 50+.

AARP Hawaii supports this measure. This bill establishes a Joint Legislative Kupuna Caucus in statute to address issues facing the aged and elderly.

AARP Hawaii has been appreciative of the Legislature's leadership in improving the quality of life for Hawaii's seniors and their family caregivers by establishing the Kupuna Caucus and Joint Legislative Committee on Aging in Place. These two legislative committees have done excellent work; however, they are temporary in nature. Furthermore, the Legislature does not currently have a subject matter committee on aging and issues of concern to seniors. In light of the aging tsunami that our state and counties will face in the near future, this proposal to statutorily establish a Joint Legislative Kupuna Caucus represents significant progress.

We thank you for your commitment to Hawaii's kupuna and family caregivers, and recommend passage of this bill.
