In consideration of HOUSE BILL 2215 RELATING TO PUBLIC HIGHWAYS

House Bill 2215 proposes to prohibit vending on any scenic lookout, pull-off, or turnaround area of a public highway. The Department of Land and Natural Resources has concerns with the bill as currently written but would not be opposed to this bill if a provision is added to allow vending from scenic lookouts with a permit. There are scenic lookouts at state parks, such as Opaekaa Falls on Kauai, where vending concessions are allowed with a permit.

The Honorable Chairpersons and Committee Members:

The Department of the Prosecuting Attorney for the County of Maui supports H.B. 2215, Relating to Public Highways.

This bill apparently seeks to correct an oversight in HRS Section 264-101 which prohibits vending from public highways.

In the past, our Department has had several cases involving vending at the scenic lookout on the Honoapiilani Highway. However, despite the scenic lookout being just a few feet from the highway, we have encountered problems with enforcing HRS Section 264-101 as it pertains to scenic lookouts. In its current state, the law appears to be ambiguous as to whether the prohibition against vending extends to the actual scenic lookout. Clearly, the intent of the statute is to prohibit vending from public highways which should also include scenic lookouts.

Accordingly, our Department supports H.B. 2215. Thank you for the opportunity to testify.

Dear Chair Souki and Members:

The Maui Police Department supports H.B. No. 2215, Relating to Public Highways. This bill would prohibit vending at scenic lookouts. Our officers have reported that vending takes place on almost a daily basis.

These vendors occupy valuable parking spaces at busy viewing areas and create a hazard by displaying their products on the sidewalks where visitors are trying to enjoy the scenery. Visitors are unable to legally park due to vendors occupying parking stalls for the entire day. State and county law enforcements are unable to enforce rules prohibiting vending because scenic lookouts weren't included in the statute prohibiting vending at these locations.

This bill would keep the parking available for visitors at the scenic lookouts and would reduce hazards by keeping walkways free of merchandise.

The Maui Police Department urges you to support H.B. No. 2215, Relating to Public Highways.
