COMMENTS

House Bill 2270 proposes to change the system of selection for recreation-residence use leases in state parks and forest reserves in counties with a population of less than 100,000 from an auction to a lottery. The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) is not opposed to such a system but points out that lease disposition by lottery will likely result in lower lease rents being paid to the State than through an auction. The Department also notes that this measure has been drafted to apply to only one park in Hawaii, giving the appearance of special legislation.
