Good morning Chair Joseph Souki, Vice-Chair Karen Awana, and members of the House Committee on Transportation

I am Mark Moses, Director of the Office of Veterans Services (OVS). I appreciate this opportunity to strongly support H.B. 2351. This measure requires veterans who submit application for veteran's license plates to provide most recent discharge document that indicates an honorable discharge from the military.

Veteran license plates identify individuals who have served this country. The veteran community and the general public believe that individuals who fail to meet certain standards of behavior and who received a less than honorable discharge should not be recognized as a veteran. The law as currently written allows those with less than an honorable discharge to receive a veteran's license plate. This measure corrects that oversight.

The OVS supports this measure as long as its implementation does not impact or replace the priorities set forth in the Executive Supplemental Budget for Fiscal Years 2010-2011.

The City and County of Honolulu is in favor of H.B. No. 2351 which requires proof of honorable service as a condition for issuance of any military specialty license plates.


This bill clearly specifies honorable service as oppose to the current law that implies honorable service as a prerequisite for issuance.
