Thank you for the opportunity to testify in opposition this important measure. The purpose of this measure is to exempt state department of transportation development and construction of highways and airports from Special Management Area (SMA) permitting and approval of county agencies.

The Maui County Council has not had the opportunity to take a formal position on this measure. Therefore, I am providing this testimony in my capacity as an individual member of the Maui County Council.

I oppose this measure for the following reasons:

- 1. This bill usurps county authority and repudiates home rule principles. Airport and highway-related improvements are likely to have substantial impacts on local economic, social, and environment conditions. Therefore, local government should retain authority on decisions about airport and highway-related improvements to the greatest possible extent
- 2. This bill violates the spirit, if not the letter, of the Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972 (Title 16, U.S. Code, Sections 1451 et seq.) and the Hawaii Coastal Zone Management Act of 1977 (Chapter 205A, Hawaii Revised Statutes). In enacting these vitally important environmental statutes, the United States Congress and the Hawaii State Legislature, respectively, expressed a strong intent for local authority in coastal land use decisions. That intent is currently reflected in the existing SMA permitting scheme established throughout the State of Hawaii and in the County of Maui.

For the foregoing reasons, I oppose this measure.

The Department of Planning and Permitting has the following **concerns** and **comments** on this proposed legislation for your consideration:

- 1. The bill appears unnecessary, since the City has an ongoing Express State Permit ("ESP") process with several State departments, including the State Department of Transportation. The ESP is a cooperative process intended to accelerate the review and permitting process and to overcome any barriers that might impede the progress of State construction projects. The ESP is meant to provide for the general welfare of the public without abandoning existing laws and regulations. The ESP enables the State to apply for and immediately receive a building permit, provided that the State agrees to self-certify certain aspects of plan review and inspection processes. Along with permits, the ESP provides a checklist of requirements for the closing of building permits and issuance of certificates of occupancy.
- 2. Typically, development permits are required to ensure that proposed development complies with applicable codes and engineering standards; e.g., the building or fire code. However, they are also necessary to ensure that infrastructure is adequate and developers obtain proper authorization to connect to or utilize county-owned infrastructure, such as water, sewer, and streets. Although we do not object to the exemption

from the PRU permit requirement, we are concerned that this bill will give the State Department of Transportation unilateral, unlimited powers in developing airports and State-owned roads regardless of their potential impacts on county-owned infrastructure. It seems that the bill will give the State carte-blanche authority to make connections to county-owned water and sewer systems without first obtaining county connection permits. For areas where State-owned roads and City-owned streets intersect or connect, we are concerned that the bill will give the State the right to alter, modify, or reconstruct county-owned streets without any permit or concurrence from the counties.

3. Although we do not object to the bill's provision for exemption from county agencies' special management area permitting requirements, the bill should make clear that compliance with the Federally mandated CZM and NEPA regulations would still be required, and that would be handled and/or processed by a State agency.

The bill requires definition of what 'new' construction actually is. Expansions and hardening of the shoreline where it is presently natural is a poor choice when our economy depends more on beaches and pristine shorelines than created limited-term construction jobs that benefit a small minority of the population. Expediting improvements within existing footprints is appropriate and would benefit the construction industry significantly. Projects that have little influence on coastal processes, such as security fencing and perimeter fencing at Kahului Airport should not require extensive SMA review. In contrast, armoring the shoreline on west Maui between Puamana and the pali tunnel fails to consider a far more beneficial opportunity. That opportunity, which would create numerous construction jobs, is to relocate the existing highway inland and out of the flood and tsunami inundation areas. One major hurricane or failure of the existing roadway would leave thousands of people and tourists stranded and could seriously jeopardize recovery and response efforts if Lahaina Harbor was compromised (for example if a ship sank in the harbor's entryway). Write a bill that is broad enough to address future unforeseen circumstances, but narrow enough to underscore the intent. If the intent is to fast track federal funded projects and get construction moving, then consider improving what exists and reduce those projects that degrade important environmental assets such as beaches, ocean recreation access points, favored fishing spots, and oceanic views. Please be responsible with our environmental assets - they can not be remade once destroyed by poor planning and short term ideas. Finally, please do not exclude the public from voicing its opinion on projects which will impact public trust domain resources. Thank you for your consideration.

I am testifying in support for House Bill 2433, Relating to Transportation.

I previously occupied the position of Airports Administrator for the Department of Transportation. I am presently a member of the Commission on Transportation. I do not represent either the Department of Transportation or the position of the Commission on Transportation on HB 2433.

Special Management Areas in each of the counties establish the projects that require permits for development of facilities. These areas are shown on maps at county agencies responsible for designating the SMA. The fact that an airport may have a part of its boundary on the shoreline will subject most of the airport to SMA regulations regardless of the distance from the shoreline of any planned construction. In addition to airport projects, any improvements planned by the tenants of the airport are subject to SMA permit requirements of the county. Permits are required for tenant improvements in spite of the fact that the Airports Division obtained an SMA permit for the terminal facilities and properties, which are subsequently leased to an airline or concessionaire.

The Department of Transportation has attempted without success in the past to include the Airports Division in the exemption from county SMA regulations granted to the Harbors Division since both Divisions plan and develop facilities in practically identical fashion. All projects are subject to extensive authorization, planning, coordination, public hearing and public announcements, which gave public and private agencies and the community several opportunities to express their support or opposition to the program. Judging from the experience with the harbor developments, I believe the airport program will be equally concerned for the issues of shoreline management, which is the basis for the SMA oversight of the counties.

The reef runway at Honolulu International Airport was built before the passage of the Coastal Management Act and was one of the first projects to comply with the National Environmental Protection Act. Substantial planning and mitigation measures were taken to minimize the impact on the shoreline affected by the project. This project has proven to be an outstanding example of the concern for the stewardship the Department of Transportation has for our valuable shoreline resources.

Thank you for the opportunity to testify on this measure. I urge your passage of HB 2433 and would be happy to respond to any questions you may have.

PRP would respectfully ask that the House Committee on Energy & Environmental Protection Committee keep this bill alive to provide for the legislative discourse on the merits/demerits of this particular legislative proposal as recommended by the Legislature directed task force of Hawaii's economic impact on Hawaii's economy to be fully vetted.

TESTIMONY IN STRONG OPPOSITION TO HB 2433

Aloha Chair Morita and Members of the Committee:

The Hawai'i Chapter of the Sierra Club strongly opposes HB 2433, which would allow the state Department of Transportation to ignore county regulations. It would also allow environmentally damaging developments to escape the necessary oversight and analysis currently required in the Coastal Zone Management Act.

Because state and county agencies are typically more concerned with their mission than the environment, these agencies tend to marginalize environmental concerns. For example, the Department of Transportation attempted to issue a series of "finding of no significant impacts" with the Kahului Airport until the environmental community successfully sued. It's frankly ludicrous that any agency would contend that the construction or expansion of an airport would have no significant environmental impacts . . . but DOT did, and now is seeking authority to avoid these types of bothersome regulations in the future.

It's because of this inability to objectively analyze all relevant factors that our legal system has created a series of checks and balances (state and county approval) and public notification requirements. This measure proposes to eliminate this balance. It would eliminate regulations that ensure:

- the public is well informed of projects before they are authorized;
- that community members -- your constituents -- are able to participate in the planning process;
- that the public and the counties can suggest ways to improve projects to save money, protect natural resources, or satisfy community concerns; and

• save money in the long-term by preventing fool-hardy and short-sighted decisions.

We also note this measure wrongly justifies the removal of environmental regulations by stating it would allow a quicker expenditure of funds from the federal American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009. This ignores one of the express purposes of the ARRA funds, namely to improve transportation *and* environmental protection.¹ That's why funds were supposed to be focused on "shovel ready" projects, namely projects that have already gone through the permitting process rather than be used as an excuse to eliminate the regulatory process.

This bill is described as an economic stimulus measure. As written, it is a penny-wise, pound-foolish proposal. Do we really want to encourage the development of highways and airports without examining the particularized impacts on the neighborhood or the marine environment? The economic benefit -- if any -- is not worth the destruction of our democratic process and the resulting risks to our natural environment.

We hope you will defer this measure indefinitely. Thank you for the opportunity to testify.

My name is Jim Tollefson and I am the President and CEO of The Chamber of Commerce of Hawaii ("The Chamber").

The Chamber is the largest business organization in Hawaii, representing more than 1,100 businesses. Approximately 80% of our members are small businesses with less than 20 employees. As the "Voice of Business" in Hawaii, the organization works on behalf of its members, which employ more than 200,000 individuals, to improve the state's economic climate and to foster positive action on issues of common concern.

The Chamber generally supports H.B. No. 2433 with certain clarifications.

The bill proposes to amend Chapters 261-4 and 264-7 HRS to exempt all State DOT-Airports and Highways projects from the County's Special Area Management (SMA) permitting requirements. It also exempts any State or County highway project from all county approvals.

Section 1 of the bill states that due to the period of high economic turmoil, procedural changes are necessary to provide the State the ability for quick recovery and successful economic stimulation. The proposed changes would allow the federal economic recovery program to be initiated quickly.

The bill also states the bill would implement one of the recommendations from the Construction Task Force established pursuant to Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 132, S.D. 1 (2009).

While the bill cites the Federal economic recovery program as one of the basis to get State Airport and Highway projects constructed quickly, the proposed amendments are not limited to federal economic recovery program projects. The proposed amendments to the Statutes would result in a "total exemption from county permits" for all future State Airport and Highway projects.

Clarification is needed on whether the bill is needed for only the federal economic recovery program projects or for a categorical exemption from county permits for all State DOT Projects. If it is the former than the language in the bill requires clarification to limit the exemption to only those federal economic recovery program projects.

If it is the later, then perhaps the legislature should extend government permitting/approval exemptions to other projects that could be viewed as an economic recovery program for the State such as exempting the Honolulu High Capacity Transit project from all State and County permits/approvals. This would also be consistent with recommendations from the Construction Task Force.

FIND THE PEA

FIND THE PEA: A slew of emails over the past two days have come in from activists on Maui, the Big Island and Kaua`i with a subject line of "Bad Bill Alert" regarding a hearing for HB2433, scheduled for tomorrow at 9 a.m..

Simply put, according to it's purpose the bill, if passed, "(e)xempts from county approval state department of transportation development and construction of highways and airports".

But while some of the emails were partially accurate, overall they were confusing and incomplete.

According to the bill itself:

Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, all structures and improvements to land to be used for state or county highway purposes:

- (1) May be planned, designed, and constructed by the appropriate state or county department without the approval of county agencies;
- (2) Shall be exempt from any county permitting requirements; and
- (3) Shall be exempt from any county agencies' special management area permitting requirements

It also similarly exempts airports.

Let's start with some debunking. First of all the bill would not, as some said, exempt the Harbors Division because harbors are the one area that is already exempted from county permitting That includes exemption from the Shoreline Management Area (SMA) permits for which the counties are responsible, as PNN exclusively and extensively reported in the fall of 2007 during the Hawai`i Superferry (HSf) debacle.

This bill- which is similar to ones that have been introduced every session of the legislature in recent years- would grant the same exemption to airports and this year adds on

state highways, something that Kaua`i Representative Mina Morita told PNN at the time she opposed but feared would someday pass.

At the time we tried to find out why there was no SMA permit for the Superferry and our queries wound their way from the unreturned phone calls to the Kaua`i Planning Department all the way up to Mike Formby the head of the Harbors Division of the Department of Land and Natural Resources (DLNR) who informed us of and cited the exemption.

But the problem is that the state has no right to trump the federal Coastal Zone Management Act (CZMA) which requires the states to protect the shorelines.

As we wrote in a November of 2007 investigative report:

Formby has repeatedly refused, in writing, to answer repeated requests for required documentation of compliance with the federal Coastal Zone Management Act (CZMA). Rather, has refused to answer or discuss any issues of federal law.

When asked for the documentation of state compliance with various processes required by federal law, Formby, an attorney, has refused to provide documentation for compliance. He also refused to discuss and legal issues relating to any federal regulations

He has cited a state law exempting harbors from compliance all county permits, including Shoreline Management Area (SMA) permitting which though federal law is issued at the local level- in Hawai`i at the county level.

The state is in effect playing a shell game in which they have given the responsibility for enforcing the CZMA- imposed upon it by the federal government and which they can't legislate their way out of- to the counties under one shell and under another they have exempted harbors from county permitting which they can legislate.

Neat trick, eh?

So with all the legal actions at the time why didn't anyone file suit in federal court based on the lack of enforcement of the CZMA in order to stop the HSf until the counties issued SMA permits?

That became PNN's \$64,000 question at the time. Turns out it would have cost even more than \$64,000- and another set of attorneys- to open another suit, especially in federal court where Maui attorneys who were fighting the infamous HSf "EIS" case had already lost an earlier unrelated round.

Although a small group of concerned Kaua`i citizens contacted a prominent CZMA attorney in San Francisco and tried to secure funding for a federal challenge to the exemption, the lion's share of the legal fund contributions for fighting the HSf were being directed toward the EIS case on Maui and the federal suit was never filed.

We're pretty sure the legislature is counting on the fact that they've been exempting harbors from the SMA for years without a challenge to say they can also exempt airports and now highway projects given their Superferry-proven penchant for the Minotaur behavior of "doing what's wrong as long as they can".

While the Bad Bill Alert alerted us to the upcoming hearing in Morita's EEP Committee tomorrow they failed to report the current status of the bill which has already been heard and passed unanimously out of the Joe Souki's TRN Committee and in fact has passed second reading in the house with the referral to EEP.

Maui Tomorrow Foundation, Inc. thanks you for the opportunity to testify in opposition to HB 2433, a measure to exempt the State Department of Transportation, Highways and Airports divisions, from county Special Management Area (SMA) and any county permitting requirements for the development and construction of highways and airports.

We are opposed because this bill preempts county authority and dismisses home rule principles; it goes against important environmental statues, including the Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972 and the Hawaii Coastal Zone Management Act of 1977, both of which were intended to keep local authority in coastal land use decisions.

Planning based on Oahu for neighbor island projects leads to expensive mistakes, such as the example of the Hawaii Superferry barge system which created hazardous conditions at north-facing Kahului Harbor. The State Department of Transportation ignored important information from Maui County that would have provided the State with a better project.

Please don't put into place legislation that will set a bad precedent for future decision-making. Give the knowledge which each island holds the respect that it deserves.

HB2433 is another cynical attempt to bypass environmental law as was the earlier bill to illegally let the Superferry operate while a phony environmental Impact Statement was being prepared. That bill was killed by a Hawaii Supreme court ruling but the proponents, who obviously have no respect for law, are at it again.

Although there are apparently many aspects to the bill, it would apparently allow a military version of the Superferry to operate freely in Hawaiian waters without previously doing a full scale environmental impact statement. This will pose a continuing threat to Humpback whales and other marine mammals.

Proponents of the Superferry had argued that the vessel would not be a threat to marine mammals - but on approximately Jan. 20, 2009, a collision occurred near Maui that probably killed a large whale as indicated by a large bump felt by some passangers. Coincidentally, NOAA had a representative aboard that managed to cover-up any possible after-effects of the collision. A few days earlier I had written an e-mail pointing out that it would be difficult to verify a whale collision with the Superferry because the whales carcass would be unlikely to be impaled on the sharp pontoons. It would more likely be cut into two pieces which would rapidly disappear in the wake of the fast-moving vessel. The same thing would occur from collisions with military versions of the Superferry. In the case of collisions with smaller marine mammals, the bump would probably be too small to be felt.

In any case, a military version of the Superferry should be kept out of Hawaiian waters during the Humpback whale season. HB2433 will pose a new threat to marine mammals.


Comments:

Support and Comments regarding HB 2433 Relating to Transportation (Exempts DOT Highways and Airports from County Approvals)

Honorable Representative Hermina M. Morita, Chair, Representative Denny Coffman, Vice Chair and Members of the House Committee on Energy and Environmental Protection,

My name is Dave Arakawa, and I am the Executive Director of the Land Use Research Foundation of Hawaii (LURF), a private, non-profit research and trade association whose members include major Hawaii landowners, developers and a utility company. One of LURF's missions is to advocate for reasonable, rational and equitable land use planning, legislation and regulations that encourage well-planned economic growth and development, while safeguarding Hawaii's significant natural and cultural resources and public health and safety.

<u>LURF's Position</u>. LURF has comments and concerns, but also <u>strongly</u> <u>supports</u> **HB 2433**, which exempts the State Department of Transportation's (DOT) development and construction of highways and airports from county approval.

The City and County of Honolulu (City), however, has legitimate and major concerns regarding whether the deadlines are unrealistic and unreasonable, given current circumstances. Thus, we strongly encourage DOT to work together with the counties to develop policies, procedures and opportunities which can lead to realistic and reasonable implementation of this bill.

Background. Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 132, S.D. 1 (2009) established a Construction Industry Task Force to determine the economic contributions of the construction industry in Hawaii. As directed in the concurrent resolution, the Task Force has developed a series of proposals for state actions to preserve and create new jobs in the local construction industry. The intent of this bill is to implement one of the Task Force's proposals.

We agree with the views of the Task Force, that in this period of high economic turmoil, procedural changes are necessary to provide the State the ability for quick recovery and

successful economic stimulation. The federal government has instituted an economic recovery program that is based on the abilities of state agencies to begin and complete construction projects. To facilitate the federal program, it is necessary for the State to make changes to its laws and programs that will allow state funded construction projects to move forward quickly and efficiently.

The Task Force also believes that it is necessary to provide the DOT Airports and Highways Division with the same type of county exemptions from shoreline management area permits that are provided to the DOT Harbors Division.

We understand that this exemption is also necessary to allow both the DOT Airports and Highways Divisions to progress with construction work which is necessary to a project's "footprint" and to contain escalating construction costs.

<u>City's Concerns</u>. The City has expressed the following legitimate concerns, which should be addressed by DOT:

- The City has commented that the bill appears unnecessary, since the City and DOT are involved in an ongoing Express State Permit process (ESP), to accelerate the review and permitting process, without abandoning existing laws and regulations. According to the City, under the ESP program, DOT could immediately receive a building permit, provided that DOT agrees to self certify certain aspects of the plan review and inspection processes.
- Concerns have been expressed by the City regarding compliance with applicable codes and engineering standards and proper City authorization to connect to, or utilize county-owned infrastructure, such as water, sewer and streets.
- DOT should work with the City regarding any potential impacts on county-owned infrastructure.
- Another concern expressed by the City is that the bill might give the State the right to alter, modify, or reconstruct City-owned streets without any permit or concurrence from the counties.
- Lastly, a clarification may be in order, which would confirm that compliance with the Federally-mandated CZM and NEPA regulations would still be required and processed by a State agency.

Conclusion. We would respectfully recommend that your Committee consider amendments and/or recommend further policies or rules, which would address the City's concerns. We are also confident that DOT could work together with the counties to develop policies, procedures and opportunities which can lead to realistic and reasonable implementation of this bill.

We appreciate the opportunity to present our **comments**, **concerns and strong support of HB 2433**, and we ask for your favorable consideration of this bill.
