RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

Chair McKelvey, Vice Chair Choy, and committee members, thank you for the opportunity to testify on HB 2441.

This bill requires contracts to be awarded within thirty days of the bid opening date limited to projects of the state departments of Hawaiian home lands and transportation, county boards of water supply, and county departments of housing, planning and permitting, and transportation. The State Procurement Office does not support this bill.

Reviews of procurement documents are to ensure award will be made to the responsive and responsible bidder, taking into consideration all factors to be evaluated such as specifications, qualifications, capability, compliance requirements, etc. On less complicated solicitations the review, evaluation and award may be completed within 30 days, however, on more complex, detailed solicitations, all documents need to be verified prior to an award. With the downsizing of government, these agencies may already be having resource issues affecting the review of the procurement documents on a timely basis.

This review process may also be delayed not by the agency, but by the bidder by not furnishing the necessary documents in a timely manner.

This proposed bill would not accomplish the goal of striking a balance between expedited procedures and necessary accountability and transparency, and will likely compromise the evaluation process if award is required within a 30-day time period as these agencies will need to make award but contingent upon completing the requirements noted above.

TESTIMONY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

COMMITTEE ON ECONOMIC REVITALIZATION, BUSINESS, & MILITARY AFFAIRS

HOUSE BILL NO. 2441, RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

While the Department of Transportation ("DOT") supports expediting the procurement process for projects, we do not support this bill as it is currently written. The DOT does support expediting the awarding of projects within thirty (30) days of bid opening. There are however, instances beyond the DOT's control to comply with this 30-day period that could result in the award of the contract being delayed. For example, the bid prices that DOT receives may exceed the amount of available funds. In these situations, the DOT is able to either: request that the bidders hold their bid price to allow the DOT time to seek additional funds; negotiate with the lowest responsible bidder to come within the available funds; or cancel the project.

We would request that this bill be amended to provide exemptions to the 30-day period for situations where the procurement involves a design-build criterion, or where the lowest responsible bid exceeds the available funds, or if negotiating with the bidder would result in a situation that is in the best interest of the public.
