HAWAII PUBLIC HOUSING AUTHORITY

The Hawaii Public Housing Authority (HPHA) <u>strongly supports</u> H.B. 2568, SD1 reducing the quorum requirement for the HPHA Board of Directors. The change to require only a simple majority, 6 members, to conduct business would enhance the Board's ability to deal with business in a timely manner.

The current requirement that 7 of the 11 members of the Board be present to conduct business has hindered the efficient operation of the Board. Because Board members come from each county to attend meetings, there are occasions when travel schedules result in fewer than 7 members being present and business cannot be conducted timely. Other state boards such as those of the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Corporation, the Board of Education, and Land and Natural Resources require only a simple majority to conduct business. We support amending the quorum for HPHA's Board to a similar requirement.
