HOUSE BILL 2574, RELATING TO PARKING FOR DISABLED PERSONS

1 Department's Position: The Department of Health strongly supports this Administration bill.

2 Fiscal Implications: Neutral

3 **Purpose and Justification:** The Disability and Communication Access Board, an agency attached to

4 the Department of Health, is the state agency responsible for the overall coordination and administration

5 of this federally required (PL 100-641) program. The proposed changes and rationale are:

6 1. <u>Clearly sets forth the State/Disability and Communication Access Board as the issuing agency.</u>

7 The permit is a state permit and federal requirements are imposed on the state, not the counties.

8 Although the counties have issued the permits on behalf of the state, this amendment more

9 accurately reflects the legal requirements of federal law while still providing the state with the

0 flexibility needed should the program need to revert to the state in the future. Section 2 of the bill

1 allows the Disability and Communication Access Board to enter into agreements with the counties

2 to issue placards on behalf of the State/Disability and Communication Access Board with financial

- 3 arrangements contingent upon funding.
- 4 2. <u>Removes the reimbursement rate to the counties from the statute and places it into the</u>

5 <u>administrative rules.</u> As public policy, the rates should not be in the statute. The amendment also

- 1 permits the counties to retain any fees collected, an amount they currently remit to the state general
- 2 fund. This will simplify accounting procedures.
- 3 3. Extends the life of the placard from four to six years. In the long run, this will be a cost saving
- 4 measure that will not compromise the integrity of the certification process.
- 5 4. Makes other housekeeping amendments.
- 6 Thank you for the opportunity to testify on this measure.

SUBJECT: HB 2574 - RELATING TO PARKING FOR DISABLED PERSONS

The position and views expressed in this testimony do not represent nor reflect the position and views of the Department of Health.

The State Council on Developmental Disabilities **SUPPORTS THE INTENT OF HB 2574**. The purpose of this bill is to designate the Disability and Communication Access Board (DCAB) as the issuing agency responsible for removable windshield placards, temporary removable windshield placards, special license plates, and identification cards. The bill also deletes the Counties as the issuing agency and increases qualifying disability from four to six years.

Designating DCAB as the issuing agency would result in an increase in overall administrative efficiency in implementing the parking program and elimination of unnecessary duplication between DCAB and the Counties. Extending the life of the placard from four to six years would be a cost savings to the State and not negatively affect the integrity of the program.

Chair Yamane, Vice Chair Nishimoto and members of the Committee:

My name is Peter Fritz and I am testifying in support of H.B. 2574.

The DCAB is required by §103-50 HRS, to review all plans and specifications for the construction of state and county buildings, facilities, and sites to ensure access for persons with disabilities.

Last session, the 5.5 positions budgeted to review plans and designs were deleted from the FY 11 budget with the intent that monies would be generated by fees would pay the expenses of plan review. Unfortunately, the bill that would provide authority to charge for plan review bill did not pass.

This bill will give the DCAB the authority to charge a review/filing fee to keep the review process functioning, provide a revenue stream, and the authority to establish a fee schedule.
