### **HB 2729 RELATING TO AGRICULTURE**

Chair Tsuji and Members of the Committees:

My name is Alan Gottlieb, and I am the President of the Hawaii Cattlemen's Council. The Hawaii Cattlemen's Council, Inc. (HCC) is the Statewide umbrella organization comprised of the five county level Cattlemen's Associations. Our 130+ member ranchers represent over 60,000 head of beef cows; more than 75% of all the beef cows in the State. Ranchers are the stewards of approximately 25% of the State's total land mass.

The Hawaii Cattlemen's Council <u>supports</u> HB 2729 to include to the definition of "agricultural commodity", and any animal included in section 142-49 or its carcass or meat, whether produced in the State or imported".

Over the years we have come across definitions of agriculture commodities which have not included livestock, or the meat from livestock agriculture, and have sought to have those corrected so they do include that definition. The problem is that there are so many different places where there are definitions, we seem to need to deal with them one by one as they come to our attention. In the past the legislature has always been very supportive on this very common sense issue.

At the same time, we ask to amend the "Island Ag Product" definition, to include livestock of the bovine, swine, sheep, or goat species or carcasses or meat of those species, that are produced in the State. These have not been included in the Island Ag Product (IAP) definition, and are produced by local livestock producers in the State, and shipped within the islands.

We appreciate this opportunity to provide testimony on this matter.
