Aloha Representative Carroll, Chair, and members of the Committee on Hawaiian Affairs.

Thank you for the opportunity to testify in support of H.B. 2760, which establishes a Native Hawaiian Research, Science, and Technology Park by the OHA and the Hawaiian Homes Commission.

As the state of Hawai'i seeks to encourage and support locally owned businesses and self-sufficiency, this bill would enable a place for the growth of Native Hawaiian entrepreneurs. Its establishment is consistent with the mission of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs and the Hawaiian Homes Commission.

Recommend, however, that where the words "native Hawaiian" exist in the bill, it be changed to "Native Hawaiian" to assure inclusion of all Native Hawaiian entrepreneurs, without regard to blood quantum. The small "n" normally refers to those native Hawaiians with 50% or more blood quantum.
