ON HB 2760 RELATING TO NATIVE HAWAIIANS

Chair Carroll, Vice-Chair Shimabukuro and Members of the Committee:

The Hawaiian Homes Commission and Department of Hawaiian Home Lands are not in support of this legislation which adds a section to the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act to establish a Native Hawaiian technology park.

While we are not opposed to economic development initiatives, we do not consider this legislation to be the best mechanism to create a resource center for Native Hawaiian entrepreneurs. The Hawaiian Homes Commission Act and our mission clearly define our beneficiaries as native Hawaiians of a 50% blood quantum. It is impractical to implement this bill and ensure that funding from our department is used only for the benefit of our beneficiaries. Further, HB 2760 conflicts with the Administration's budgetary goals and objectives for fiscal year 2010-2011.
