I feel we all have the right to move our bodies moderately every where we are. The screws in my ankles make it difficult to stand whether there is music playing or not. Technically a business with a liquor license could be fined for allowing me to walk around in their establishment because of the swagger in my step. If I am standing there moving side to side only a few inches a bouncer is suppose to, in compliance with the Maui County Liquor Laws ask me to stop moving. I wore braces on my legs for 16 years. I have had six heal cord lengthening surgery and four triple arthrodeses where Shriners hospital cut out pieces of my ankle to make me stand flat footed.

I saw a guy get put in a head lock and thrown out of a bar for the simple reason that he was dancing. There was less then a dozen patrons in the bar and none of them minding his dancing but the bouncer had been pressured for weeks by liquor enforcers to enforce the no dancing rule.

Please allow us to moderately move our bodies in places that liquor is severed. I do not like feeling like a criminal because I can not stand still.
